1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 1910

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend House Bill 1910 by replacing  
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Illinois Local Library Act is amended by  
5 adding Section 1-8 as follows:

6 (75 ILCS 5/1-8 new)

7 Sec. 1-8. Opioid antagonists.

8 (a) As used in this Section:

9 "Authorized personnel" means an employee or volunteer of  
10 the library who has completed training under subsection (d).

11 "Department" means the Department of Human Services.

12 "Library" means a public library established under or  
13 otherwise subject to the requirements of this Act.

14 "Opioid antagonist" means a drug approved by the federal  
15 Food and Drug Administration or recommended for use by the  
16 World Health Organization that, when administered, negates or

1 neutralizes in whole or in part the pharmacological effects of  
2 an opioid in the body. "Opioid antagonist" shall be limited to  
3 medications approved by the Department for such purpose.

4 (b) All libraries open to the general public in this State  
5 shall maintain a supply of opioid antagonists in an accessible  
6 location.

7 (c) Any authorized personnel may administer an opioid  
8 antagonist to any person whom the authorized personnel  
9 believes, in good faith, to be having an opioid overdose (i) on  
10 library grounds, (ii) in the immediate vicinity of the  
11 library, or (iii) at a library-sponsored event. Authorized  
12 personnel may carry an opioid antagonist while in the library  
13 or at a library-sponsored activity.

14 (d) During operating hours, a library shall take  
15 reasonable steps necessary to have at least one person present  
16 in the library who has completed training in how to recognize  
17 and respond to an opioid overdose, including the  
18 administration of an opioid antagonist. Training may be  
19 conducted by an organization recognized for providing such  
20 training or may be created by the library using free resources  
21 available on the website of the Department or the website of  
22 the Department of Public Health.

23 (e) A library and its authorized personnel are immune from  
24 liability for the administration of an opioid antagonist under  
25 this Section, except that authorized personnel may be liable  
26 for acts of gross recklessness or acts intended to cause harm.

1 Nothing in this Section shall be construed to create a duty to  
2 act for any authorized personnel.

3 (f) The Director of Human Services may identify  
4 organizations qualified to offer the training required by  
5 subsection (d) and may make a list of such organizations  
6 available on the Department's website.

7 (g) A public library may receive an opioid antagonist from  
8 any lawful source."
