

104TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2025 and 2026 HB2584

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

215 ILCS 200/52 new 305 ILCS 5/5-54 new

Amends the Prior Authorization Reform Act and the Illinois Public Aid Code. Provides that a health insurance issuer, the fee-for-service medical assistance program, and a Medicaid managed care organization may not require prior authorization for the following prescription drug types and their therapeutic equivalents approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration: human immunodeficiency virus pre-exposure prophylaxis and post-exposure prophylaxis medication or human immunodeficiency virus treatment medication. Effective January 1, 2027.

1 AN ACT concerning regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Prior Authorization Reform Act is amended by adding Section 52 as follows:
- 6 (215 ILCS 200/52 new)
- 7 Sec. 52. Prior authorization for certain prescription drugs; prohibited. A health insurance issuer may not require 8 9 prior authorization for the following prescription drug types and their therapeutic equivalents approved by the United 10 States Food and Drug Administration: human immunodeficiency 11 12 virus pre-exposure prophylaxis and post-exposure prophylaxis medication or human immunodeficiency virus treatment 13 14 medication.
- Section 10. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by adding Section 5-54 as follows:

- Sec. 5-54. Prior authorization for certain prescription

 drugs; prohibited. The fee-for-service medical assistance

 program and a Medicaid managed care organization may not

 require prior authorization for the following prescription

- drug types and their therapeutic equivalents approved by the
- 2 <u>United States Food and Drug Administration: human</u>
- 3 <u>immunodeficiency</u> virus pre-exposure prophylaxis and
- 4 post-exposure prophylaxis medication or human immunodeficiency
- 5 virus treatment medication.
- 6 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect January
- 7 1, 2027.
