SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Underserved Health Care Provider Workforce Act. Changes the definition of "designated shortage area" to mean an area designated as a medically underserved area or a health professional shortage area (rather than a physician shortage area, a medically underserved area, or a critical health manpower shortage area). Changes the term "eligible medical student" to "eligible student", and includes in the definition of that term a person who is studying optometry in an optometry college or institution located in Illinois and that a person may agree to practice full-time in a designated shortage area as an optometrist or anesthesiologist one year for each year he or she is a scholarship recipient. Includes a rural health center, a federally qualified health center, a federally qualified health center look alike, and an optometric office in the definition of "medical facility". Includes an optometrist in the definition of "eligible health care provider". Includes an obstetrician or gynecologist in the definition of "primary care physician". Includes loan repayment recipients in a provision regarding scholarship recipients who fail to fulfill specified obligations, and provides that the amounts paid by these scholarship or loan repayment recipients shall be deposited into the fund where the payment originated from (rather than the Community Health Center Care Fund). Repeals a different provision defining "primary care physician". Effective January 1, 2026.

1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Underserved Health Care Provider Workforce
5 Act is amended by changing Sections 3.04, 3.07, 3.08, 3.09,
6 3.10, 4.03, and 10 and by adding Section 3.12 as follows:

7 (110 ILCS 935/3.04) (from Ch. 144, par. 1453.04)

8 Sec. 3.04. "Designated Shortage Area" means an area
9 designated as ~~by the Director as a physician shortage area,~~ a
10 medically underserved area~~,~~ or a health professional shortage
11 area ~~critical health manpower shortage area~~ as defined by the
12 United States Department of Health and Human Services,
13 ~~Education and Welfare,~~ or as further defined by the Department
14 to enable it to effectively fulfill the purpose stated in
15 Section 2 of this Act. Such areas may include the following:

16 (a) an urban or rural area which is a rational area for
17 the delivery of health services;

18 (b) a population group;

19 (c) a public or nonprofit private medical facility; or

20 (d) a government-owned, privately owned, independent,
21 or provider-based Rural Health Clinic or hospital that
22 accepts Medicaid, Medicare, the State's Children's Health
23 Insurance Program, private insurance, and self-pay.

3 Sec. 3.07. "Eligible ~~medical~~ student" means a person who
4 meets all of the following qualifications:

5 (a) he or she is an Illinois resident at the time of
6 application for a scholarship under the program
7 established by this Act;

8 (b) he or she is studying medicine in a medical school
9 located in Illinois, ~~or~~ studying chiropractic medicine in
10 a chiropractic college or institution in Illinois, or
11 studying optometry in an optometry college or institution
12 located in Illinois;

13 (c) he or she exhibits financial need as determined by
14 the Department; and

15 (d) he or she agrees to practice full-time in a
16 Designated Shortage Area as a primary care physician,
17 general surgeon, emergency medicine physician,
18 obstetrician, optometrist, anesthesiologist, or
19 chiropractic physician one year for each year he or she is
20 a scholarship recipient.

23 Sec. 3.08. "Medical facility" means a facility for the
24 delivery of health services and includes a hospital, State

1 mental health institution, public health center, outpatient
2 medical facility, rehabilitation facility, long term care
3 facility, community mental health center, migrant health
4 center, ~~a~~ community health center, rural health center,
5 federally qualified health center, federally qualified health
6 center look alike, optometric office, or ~~a~~ State correctional
7 institution.

10 Sec. 3.09. Eligible health care provider. "Eligible health
11 care provider" means a primary care physician, general
12 surgeon, emergency medicine physician, obstetrician,
13 chiropractic physician, optometrist, anesthesiologist,
14 advanced practice registered nurse, or physician assistant who
15 accepts Medicaid, Medicare, the State's Children's Health
16 Insurance Program, private insurance, and self-pay.

21 physician" means a general internist, family medicine
22 physician, obstetrician, gynecologist, or general
23 pediatrician.

2 Sec. 3.12. Optometrist. "Optometrist" means a Doctor of
3 Optometry licensed under the Illinois Optometric Practice Act
4 of 1987.

6 Sec. 4.03. To establish a program of medical student
7 scholarships and to award scholarships to eligible ~~medical~~

11 Sec. 10. Scholarship and loan repayment recipients who
12 fail to fulfill the obligation described in subsection (d) of
13 Section 3.07 or Section 4.10 of this Act shall pay to the
14 Department a sum equal to 3 times the amount of the annual
15 scholarship or loan repayment grant for each year the
16 recipient fails to fulfill such obligation. A scholarship or
17 loan repayment recipient who fails to fulfill the obligation
18 described in subsection (d) of Section 3.07 or Section 4.10
19 shall have 30 days from the date on which that failure begins
20 in which to enter into a contract with the Department that sets
21 forth the manner in which that sum is required to be paid. If
22 the contract is not entered into within that 30 day period or
23 if the contract is entered into but the required payments are

1 not made in the amounts and at the times provided in the
2 contract, the scholarship or loan payment recipient also shall
3 be required to pay to the Department interest at the rate of 9%
4 per annum on the amount of that sum remaining due and unpaid.
5 The amounts paid to the Department under this Section shall be
6 deposited into the fund where the payment originated ~~Community~~
7 ~~Health Center Care Fund and shall be used by the Department to~~
8 ~~improve access to primary health care services as authorized~~
9 ~~by subsection (a) of Section 2310-200 of the Department of~~
10 ~~Public Health Powers and Duties Law (20 ILCS 2310/2310-200).~~

11 The Department may transfer to the Illinois Finance
12 Authority, into an account outside the State treasury, moneys
13 in the Community Health Center Care Fund as needed, but not to
14 exceed an amount established, by rule, by the Department to
15 establish a reserve or credit enhancement escrow account to
16 support a financing program or a loan or equipment leasing
17 program to provide moneys to support the purposes of
18 subsection (a) of Section 2310-200 of the Department of Public
19 Health Powers and Duties Law (20 ILCS 2310/2310-200). The
20 disposition of moneys at the conclusion of any financing
21 program under this Section shall be determined by an
22 interagency agreement.
