1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 3054

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 3054 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Child Care Act of 1969 is amended by
5 changing Section 5.8 as follows:

6 (225 ILCS 10/5.8)

7 (Text of Section before amendment by P.A. 103-594)

8 Sec. 5.8. Radon testing of licensed day care centers,
9 licensed day care homes, and licensed group day care homes.

10 (a) Effective January 1, 2013, licensed day care centers,
11 licensed day care homes, and licensed group day care homes
12 shall have the facility tested for radon at least once every 3
13 years pursuant to rules established by the Illinois Emergency
14 Management Agency.

15 (b) Effective January 1, 2014, as part of an initial
16 application or application for renewal of a license for day

1 care centers, day care homes, and group day care homes, the
2 Department shall require proof the facility has been tested
3 within the last 3 years for radon pursuant to rules
4 established by the Illinois Emergency Management Agency.

5 (c) The report of the most current radon measurement shall
6 be posted in the facility next to the license issued by the
7 Department. Copies of the report shall be provided to parents
8 or guardians upon request.

9 (d) Included with the report referenced in subsection (c)
10 shall be the following statement:

11 "Every parent or guardian is notified that this
12 facility has performed radon measurements to ensure the
13 health and safety of the occupants. The Illinois Emergency
14 Management Agency (IEMA) recommends that all residential
15 homes be tested and that corrective actions be taken at
16 levels equal to or greater than 4.0 pCi/L. Radon is a Class
17 A human carcinogen, the leading cause of lung cancer in
18 non-smokers, and the second leading cause of lung cancer
19 overall. For additional information about this facility

24 (e) On and after July 1, 2026, mitigation shall be
25 required when testing confirms radon levels above 4.0 pCi/L.
26 Mitigation shall be conducted according to industry standards

1 and must be completed no later than 12 months after the testing
2 confirms radon levels above 4.0 pCi/L. If radon test results
3 are at or above 4.0 pCi/L and below 8.0 pCi/L, the licensed day
4 care center, licensed day care home, or licensed group day
5 care home shall create a corrective action plan that shall
6 include long-term radon tests that show levels below 4.0
7 pCi/L. If radon test results exceed 8.0 pCi/L, initial
8 applicants shall mitigate before a license is issued and
9 license renewal applicants shall close operations until the
10 radon standard of 4.0 pCi/L or lower is achieved.

13 Sec. 5.8. Radon testing of licensed day care centers,
14 licensed day care homes, and licensed group day care homes.

15 (a) Licensed day care centers, licensed day care homes,
16 and licensed group day care homes shall have the facility
17 tested for radon at least once every 3 years pursuant to rules
18 established by the Illinois Emergency Management Agency.

19 (b) As part of an initial application or application for
20 renewal of a license for day care centers, day care homes, and
21 group day care homes, the Department of Early Childhood shall
22 require proof the facility has been tested within the last 3
23 years for radon pursuant to rules established by the Illinois
24 Emergency Management Agency.

25 (c) The report of the most current radon measurement shall

1 be posted in the facility next to the license issued by the
2 Department of Early Childhood. Copies of the report shall be
3 provided to parents or guardians upon request.

4 (d) Included with the report referenced in subsection (c)
5 shall be the following statement:

6 "Every parent or guardian is notified that this
7 facility has performed radon measurements to ensure the
8 health and safety of the occupants. The Illinois Emergency
9 Management Agency (IEMA) recommends that all residential
10 homes be tested and that corrective actions be taken at
11 levels equal to or greater than 4.0 pCi/L. Radon is a Class
