1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 3645

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 3645, AS AMENDED,
3 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4 following:

5 "Section 5. The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems
6 Act is amended by changing Section 3.233 as follows:

7 (210 ILCS 50/3.233)

8 Sec. 3.233. Opioid overdose reporting.

9 (a) In this Section:

10 "Covered vehicle service provider" means a licensed
11 vehicle service provider ~~that is a municipality with a~~
12 ~~population of 1,000,000 or greater.~~

13 "Covered vehicle service provider personnel" means
14 individuals licensed by the Department as EMTs, EMT-Is,
15 A-EMTs, Paramedics, PHRNs, PHAPRNs, or PHPAs ~~an EMT, EMT-I,~~
16 ~~A EMT, or EMT-P~~ who are employed by a covered vehicle service

1 provider.

2 "Opioid" means any narcotic containing opium or one or
3 more of its natural or synthetic derivatives.

4 "Overdose" means a physiological event that results in a
5 life-threatening emergency to an individual who ingested,
6 inhaled, injected, or otherwise bodily absorbed an opioid.

7 (b) Covered vehicle service provider personnel who treat
8 and either release or transport to a health care facility an
9 individual experiencing a suspected or an actual overdose
10 shall document in the patient's care report the information
11 specified in subsection (c) within 24 hours of the initial
12 reporting of the incident.

13 (c) A patient care report of an overdose made under this
14 Section shall include:

15 (1) the date and time of the overdose;

16 (2) the location in latitude and longitude, to no more
17 than 4 decimal places, where the overdose victim was
18 initially encountered by the covered vehicle service
19 provider personnel;

20 (3) whether one or more doses of an opioid overdose
21 reversal drug were administered; and

22 (4) whether the overdose was fatal or nonfatal when
23 the overdose victim was initially encountered by the
24 covered vehicle service provider personnel and during the
25 transportation of the victim to a health care facility.

26 (d) Upon receipt of a patient care report that documents

1 an overdose, the Department ~~a covered vehicle service provider~~
2 shall report the information listed under subsection (c) to:

3 (i) the Washington/Baltimore High Intensity Drug
4 Trafficking Area Overdose Detection Mapping Application;
5 or

6 (ii) any similar information technology platform with
7 secure access operated by the federal government or a unit
8 of State ~~state~~ or local government, as determined by the
9 covered vehicle service provider and as approved by the
10 Department.

11 (e) Overdose information reported by a covered vehicle
12 service provider under this Section shall not be used in an
13 opioid use-related criminal investigation, ~~or~~ prosecution,
14 welfare checks, or warrant checks of the individual who was
15 treated by the covered vehicle service provider personnel for
16 experiencing the suspected or actual overdose. Any misuse of
17 the information reported by a covered vehicle service provider
18 shall result in, but is not limited to, the Department
19 reporting misuse to the Washington/Baltimore High Intensity
20 Drug Trafficking Area Overdose Detection Mapping Application
21 or a similar technology platform. The Department may adopt
22 rules to set forth standards under which misuse of access may
23 be reported to the Washington/Baltimore High Intensity Drug
24 Trafficking Area Overdose Detection Map or a similar platform
25 based on misuse or misconduct by a covered vehicle service
26 provider or other individual or entity at the discretion of

1 the Department.

2 (f) Covered vehicle service providers or covered vehicle
3 service provider personnel that in good faith make a report
4 under this Section shall be immune from civil or criminal
5 liability for making the report.

6 (g) No data that allows for or creates a risk of
7 identification of an individual or individuals experiencing a
8 suspected or actual overdose treated by the covered vehicle
9 service provider personnel shall be submitted to the
10 Washington/Baltimore High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area
11 Overdose Detection Mapping Application or a similar technology
12 platform.

13 (h) Covered vehicle service provider personnel may report
14 overdose surveillance through an identified technology
15 platform for the use of overdose surveillance under exceptions
16 to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of
17 1996 and the reported data shall only be used to support public
18 safety and public health efforts.

19 (i) Efforts shall be made by the Department to enhance
20 sharing of information to identify areas of need and provide
21 harm reduction resources and strategies when and where it is
22 most needed. This may include working with the Regional Care
23 Coordination Advisory Councils or the formation of a risk
24 reduction advisory group that may include State and local
25 public health, health care, and harm reduction providers, and
26 first responders and law enforcement to address harm reduction

1 instead of criminal prosecution.

2 (j) The Department shall partner with harm reduction
3 providers, local health departments, and law enforcement to
4 identify performance measures for the use of the overdose
5 detection mapping system surveillance data and monitor the
6 impact of the use of the system and its data. This data shall
7 also be used to develop and implement evidence-based
8 strategies to prevent opioid overdoses.
