

## 104TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2025 and 2026 HB4255

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/48-11

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Provides that the statute prohibiting elephants from performing in traveling animal acts applies to "covered animals" rather than just elephants. Defines "covered animal" as any of the following animals, and hybrids of those animals: (1) elephantidae; (2) felidae, but excluding a domestic cat; (3) non-human primate; or (4) ursidae. Provides that the provisions of the amendatory Act are in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other laws protecting animal welfare. Provides that the provisions may not be construed to limit any State law or rules protecting the welfare of animals or to prevent a unit of local government from adopting and enforcing its own animal welfare ordinances and regulations. Contains a severability provision. Effective July 1, 2026.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by
- 5 changing Section 48-11 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/48-11)
- 7 Sec. 48-11. Unlawful use of <u>a covered animal</u> an elephant
- 8 in a traveling animal act.
- 9 (a) Definitions. As used in this Section:
- 10 "Covered animal" means any of the following animals, and
- 11 hybrids of those animals:
- 12 (1) elephantidae;
- 13 (2) felidae, but excluding a domestic cat;
- 14 (3) non-human primate; or
- 15 <u>(4) ursidae.</u>
- 16 "Mobile or traveling animal housing facility" means a
- 17 transporting vehicle such as a truck, trailer, or railway car
- 18 used to transport or house animals while traveling to an
- 19 exhibition or other performance.
- 20 "Performance" means an exhibition, public showing,
- 21 presentation, display, exposition, fair, animal act, circus,
- 22 ride, trade show, petting zoo, carnival, parade, race, or
- 23 other similar undertaking in which animals are required to

perform tricks, give rides, or participate as accompaniments for entertainment, amusement, or benefit of a live audience.

"Traveling animal act" means any performance of animals where animals are transported to, from, or between locations for the purpose of a performance in a mobile or traveling animal housing facility.

- (b) A person commits unlawful use of <u>a covered animal</u> <del>an</del> <del>elephant</del> in a traveling animal act when he or she knowingly allows for the participation of <u>a covered animal</u> <del>an African</del> <del>elephant</del> (Loxodonta africana) or Asian elephant (Elephas maximus) protected under the federal Endangered Species Act of 1973</del> in a traveling animal act.
- (c) This Section does not apply to <u>performance of covered</u>
  <u>animals an exhibition of elephants</u> at a non-mobile, permanent
  institution, or other <u>fixed</u> facility, if the covered animal is
  not transported to that location for the purpose of the
  <u>performance</u>.
- (d) Sentence. Unlawful use of <u>a covered animal</u> an elephant in a traveling animal act is a Class A misdemeanor.
- (e) The provisions of this amendatory Act of the 104th General Assembly are in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other laws protecting animal welfare. This Section may not be construed to limit any State law or rules protecting the welfare of animals or to prevent a unit of local government from adopting and enforcing its own animal welfare ordinances and regulations.
