1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4379

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 4379 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Equitable Restrooms Act is amended by
5 changing Section 16 as follows:

6 (410 ILCS 35/16)

7 Sec. 16. Adult changing station.

8 (a) In this Section:

9 "Adult changing station" means a wheelchair accessible
10 toilet facility compliant with the federal Americans with
11 Disabilities Act of 1990 and regulations adopted under that
12 Act or a private, enclosed family or assisted-use toilet
13 facility, both of which shall meet all of the following
14 requirements:

15 (1) the facility contains ~~containing~~ an adult changing
16 table that is capable of serving persons of any age;

1 (2) the facility is accessible under the federal
2 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and regulations
3 adopted thereunder; and

4 (3) the facility is equipped with all of the
5 following:

6 (A) a waste receptacle;

7 (B) a toilet and a sink;

8 (C) a coat hook located in close proximity to the
9 changing surface;

10 (D) a soap dispenser;

11 (E) a paper towel dispenser;

12 (F) signage indicating "adult changing station" at
13 the entrance to the room;

14 (G) signage within the room indicating the weight
15 capacity and instructions for operation of the adult
16 changing table; and

17 (H) a side and end maneuvering clearance of at
18 least 36 inches.

19 "Adult changing table" means a powered, height-adjustable
20 table that:

21 (1) has, at a minimum, the following safety features:

22 (A) safety rails on each side that (i) are a
23 minimum of two-thirds of the length of the changing
24 surface, (ii) are centered, plus or minus 3 inches,
25 along the long open sides of the changing surface, and
26 (iii) are capable of being raised or lowered; and

1 (B) a safety belt;

2 (2) is capable of being lowered to a height of 17 ~~19~~
3 inches or less and raised to a height of at least 38
4 inches;

5 (3) is at least 30 ~~25~~ inches wide and at least 70 ~~72~~
6 inches long; and

7 (4) supports at least 400 pounds.

8 "Public building" means any one or more of the following
9 if constructed on or after January 1, 2029:

10 (1) an establishment with the capacity to serve 1,500
11 or more persons per day that is not a place of education;

12 (2) a building or structure used for exhibition or
13 entertainment, including a movie theater, performance
14 theater, concert hall, convention center, sports arena or
15 stadium, shopping mall, shopping center, or a store that
16 is larger than 40,000 square feet;

17 (3) a building or structure used for public display or
18 collection, including a museum, library, or gallery;

19 (4) a building or structure that is located in a place
20 of recreation, including a park, zoo, or amusement park,
21 and that is designated by the owner or operator of that
22 place of recreation or the owner's or operator's agent as
23 a public building under this Act;

24 (5) a building or structure, not including an athletic
25 stadium, that is located in a place of education designed
26 to educate 1,500 students or more during a semester, and

1 that is designated by the owner or operator of that place
2 of education or the owner's or operator's agent as a
3 public building under this Act;

4 (6) an airport terminal;

5 (7) a bus station;

6 (8) a hospital;

7 (9) a hospital-related outpatient clinic; or

8 (10) a rehabilitation facility.

9 "State-owned building" means the State Capitol Building, a
10 State park campground with plumbing and electricity at toilet
11 locations, a State park visitor center with plumbing and
12 electricity at toilet locations, or a rest stop located on an
13 interstate highway.

14 (b) The owner or operator of each State-owned building and
15 the owner or operator of each public building built after
16 January 1, 2029 shall do all of the following: ~~install and~~
17 ~~maintain in that building at least one adult changing station~~
18 ~~that is accessible when the building is open to the public~~

19 (1) install a minimum of one adult changing station in
20 the building;

21 (2) maintain, repair, and replace each adult changing
22 table in the building as necessary to ensure safety and
23 ease of use;

24 (3) clean each adult changing station in the building
25 with the same frequency as the other public restrooms
26 located within the building; and

1 (4) provide sufficient floor space around the adult
2 changing table in the building to comply with the
3 requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act
4 standards for accessible design, as prescribed in 28 CFR
5 35.151 and 36 CFR Part 1191, Appendices B and D.

6 (c) The owner or operator of each State-owned building and
7 the owner or operator of each public building shall ensure
8 that:

9 (1) except for places of education, the entrance to
10 each restroom in the building has conspicuous signage
11 indicating the location of the adult changing stations in
12 the building, and, for places of education, only the
13 entrance to the restroom that contains an adult changing
14 station has conspicuous signage indicating the adult
15 changing station; and

16 (2) the central directory for the building, if such a
17 directory exists, indicates the location of the adult
18 changing stations in the building.

19 (d) The owner or operator of a place of recreation
20 described in paragraph (4) of the definition of "public
21 building" in subsection (a) or that person's agent and the
22 owner or operator of a place of education described in
23 paragraph (5) of the definition of "public building" in
24 subsection (a) or that person's agent shall designate a
25 building or structure that will serve as the public building
26 for that place of recreation or education, respectively.
