Makes appropriations and reappropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 500

5 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
6 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made
7 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School
8 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation
9 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the
10 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund,
11 Multi-modal Transportation Bond Fund, and the Build Illinois
12 Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of
13 tax-exempt bonds subsequently issued by the State.

14 ARTICLE 501

15 Section 1. "AN ACT concerning appropriations", Public Act
16 104-0003, approved June 16, 2025, is amended by changing
17 Sections 95 and 100 of Article 134 as follows:

18 (P.A. 104-0003, Article 134, Section 95)

19 Sec. 95. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may be
20 necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory Waterfowl

1 Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
2 payment of grants for the implementation of the North American
3 Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of Canada or the
4 United States which specifically provides waterfowl to the
5 Mississippi Flyway as provided in the Wildlife Code, including
6 prior years' costs, as amended.

7 (P.A. 104-0003, Article 134, Section 100)

8 Sec. 100. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may be
9 necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory Waterfowl
10 Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
11 payment of grants for the development of waterfowl propagation
12 areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United States which
13 specifically provide waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway as
14 provided in the Wildlife Code, including prior years' costs,
15 as amended.

16 Section 2. "AN ACT concerning appropriations", Public Act
17 104-0003, approved June 16, 2025, is amended by adding Section
18 195 and changing Sections 15, 20, 110 of Article 135 as
19 follows:

20 (P.A. 104-0003, Article 135, Section 195 new)

21 Sec. 195. The sum of \$5,675,500, is appropriated to the
22 Department of Natural Resources from the DNR Special Projects
23 Fund for cost associated with grant or donation-funded

1 construction projects and capital improvements at State owned,
2 leased, or managed sites, including prior years' costs.

3 (P.A. 104-0003, Article 135, Section 15)

4 Sec. 15. To the extent federal funds, including
5 reimbursements, are available for such purposes, the sum of
6 \$1,295,932, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains
7 unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2025, ~~less~~
8 ~~\$920,932 to be lapsed~~ from appropriations heretofore made for
9 such purpose in Article 141, Section 20 and Article 142,
10 Section 15 of Public Act 103-0589, as amended, is
11 reappropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
12 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for construction
13 and development of facilities for transient, non-trailerable
14 recreational boats, including grants for such purposes
15 authorized under the Boating Infrastructure Grant Program.

16 (P.A. 104-0003, Article 135, Section 20)

17 Sec. 20. The sum of \$14,904,963, or so much thereof as may
18 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
19 on June 30, 2025, less \$6,350,477 ~~7,404,963~~, to be lapsed from
20 appropriations heretofore made for such purpose in Article
21 141, Section 25 and Article 142, Section 20 of Public Act
22 103-0589, as amended, is reappropriated from the State Boating
23 Act Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for multiple
24 use facilities and programs for boating purposes provided by

1 the Department of Natural Resources including construction and
2 development, all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land
3 acquisition, services, studies and all other expenses required
4 to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

5 (P.A. 104-0003, Article 135, Section 110)

6 Sec. 110. The sum of \$89,947,568, or so much thereof as may
7 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
8 on June 30, 2025, less \$76,062,820 ~~79,947,568~~, to be lapsed
9 from appropriations heretofore made for such purpose in
10 Article 141, Section 125 and Article 142, Section 110 of
11 Public Act 103-0589, as amended, is reappropriated from the
12 Park and Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural
13 Resources for construction and maintenance of State owned,
14 leased, and managed sites.

15 (P.A. 104-0003, Article 135, Section 115)

16 Sec. 115. The sum of \$7,732,857, or so much thereof as may
17 be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business
18 on June 30, 2025, less \$6,195,653 ~~6,982,857~~, to be lapsed from
19 appropriations heretofore made for such purpose in Article
20 141, Section 130, and Article 142, Section 115 of Public Act
21 103-0589, as amended, is reappropriated from the Park and
22 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
23 land acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths
24 and all other related expenses connected with the acquisition,

1 development, and maintenance of bike paths.

2 (P.A. 104-0003, Article 135, Section 180)

3 Sec. 180. The sum of \$210,367,957, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2025, ~~less~~
5 ~~\$135,367,957, to be lapsed~~ from appropriations made for such
6 purpose in Article 141, Section 170 and Article 142, Section
7 185 of Public Act 103-0589, as amended, is reappropriated from
8 the Abandoned Mined Lands Reclamation Council Federal Trust
9 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants and
10 contracts to eliminate hazards created by abandoned mines, and
11 any other expenses necessary for emergency response as
12 authorized by Section 40701 of the Infrastructure Investment
13 and Jobs Act (IIJA).

22 Section 10. The sum of \$1,000,000,000, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Commerce and

1 Community Affairs Assistance Fund to the Department of
 2 Commerce and Economic Opportunity to provide grants,
 3 contingent expenses, and expenditures for federal broadband
 4 awards provided by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act
 5 of 2021, including prior incurred costs.

 15 support and encourage: (i) commercialization of technology
