1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

21

2 WHEREAS, Community integrated living arrangements (CILAs), 3 also known as group homes, are living situations, such as a 4 house or an apartment, in communities throughout Illinois 5 intellectual/developmental where unrelated adults with disabilities (I/DD) reside; and 6 7 WHEREAS, CILAs provide community-based housing 8 essential support for nearly 9,823 adults with intellectual 9 and developmental disabilities across Illinois, many of whom 10 require extensive supervision and care; and WHEREAS, Over 200 licensed CILA providers employ thousands 11 12 of direct support professionals (DSPs) who are vital to 13 delivering daily care and maintaining residents' health, 14 safety, and independence; and WHEREAS, The State of Illinois is under the Ligas Consent 15 16 Decree, which requires expanded access to community-based 17 services for individuals with I/DD, yet the State has 18 repeatedly been found out of compliance; and WHEREAS, In 2020, the State published the Guidehouse Rate 19 20 Study, which outlined several I/DD rate changes based on

approved recommendations by the Ligas Rates Oversight

- 1 Committee with the Pritzker Administration committing to fully
- 2 funding the rate study; and
- 3 WHEREAS, From 2021 to 2025, the Department of Human
- 4 Services (DHS) has implemented portions of the Guidehouse Rate
- 5 study, and the General Assembly has made significant
- 6 investments into the I/DD community system; however, some
- 7 crucial priorities still remain partially or fully unfunded;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, Despite that progress, Governor Pritzker's FY26
- 10 introduced budget proposes eliminating one million funded DSP
- 11 hours, reducing services for all 24-hour CILA residents by
- 12 approximately 90 hours per year and threatening care quality,
- 13 community stability, and compliance with federal home and
- 14 community-based services regulations; and
- 15 WHEREAS, These proposed cuts contradict prior agreements
- and risk undermining both the State's legal obligations and
- 17 its commitment to individuals with I/DD; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The General Assembly must remain committed to
- 19 ensuring high-quality services and supports for adults with
- 20 I/DD residing in CILA group homes and to utilizing state
- 21 budgets intended to invest in improving the service array to
- do so; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Funding adequate DSP hours in FY26 is vital in 2 ensuring a healthy community system that meets federal and 3 State guidelines and ensuring that individuals with I/DD in 4 Illinois receive the quality services and supports they 5 deserve; therefore, be it
- 6 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE 7 HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that 8 we urge full restoration of all eliminated direct support 9 professionals (DSP) hours in the final FY26 State budget to 10 protect the services which individuals with upon 11 intellectual/developmental disabilities (I/DD) depend; and be it further 12
- RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, the Illinois Senate President, the Illinois Speaker of the House, and the Illinois Department of Human Services Division of Developmental Disabilities (IDHS/DDD).
