1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Giant Axonal Neuropathy (GAN) is a 3 terminal, inherited neurodegenerative disorder that affects 4 both the central and peripheral nervous systems, leading to progressive muscle weakness, impaired coordination, and other 5 6 severe symptoms; and 7 WHEREAS, GAN primarily manifests in early childhood and 8 progressively worsens over time, significantly impacting 9 mobility, motor function, and overall quality of life; and 10 WHEREAS, GAN is caused by mutations in the GAN gene, which disrupts the proper function of nerve cells, ultimately 11 12 leading to the deterioration of the nervous system; and 13 WHEREAS, GAN currently has no cure, and treatment options remain limited to symptom management and supportive care; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Approximately 75 known people have been diagnosed with GAN worldwide, including Ethan Tkalec of Riverside; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Increased awareness, research funding, and early diagnosis are critical to improving outcomes for individuals 18 19 affected by GAN and their families; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Advocacy organizations, medical researchers, and
- 2 healthcare providers are working diligently to advance
- 3 scientific understanding and explore potential therapies for
- 4 GAN; and
- 5 WHEREAS, It is imperative that the State of Illinois
- 6 recognizes the challenges faced by individuals living with GAN
- 7 and their caregivers and supports initiatives to enhance
- 8 research, education, and awareness of this rare disease;
- 9 therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE
- 11 HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that
- 12 we declare May 28, 2025 as Giant Axonal Neuropathy Awareness
- 13 Day in the State of Illinois to raise public awareness of Giant
- 14 Axonal Neuropathy (GAN), encourage research efforts, and
- 15 support affected individuals and their families; and be it

- 17 RESOLVED, That we encourage the collaboration of public
- and private entities, healthcare professionals, and research
- 19 institutions to advance medical research and treatment options
- 20 for GAN; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be

- 2 to improving the lives of those affected by this condition.
