of Illinois 2 WHEREAS, The members the House of 3 Representatives are saddened to learn of the death of Sister 4 Jean Dolores Schmidt of the Sisters of Charity of the Blessed 5 Virgin Mary (BVM), the iconic chaplain of the University Chicago men's basketball team, the Ramblers, who 6 7 passed away on October 9, 2025 at the age of 106; and

WHEREAS, Sister Jean was born Dolores Bertha Schmidt to Joseph and Bertha (Bowman) Schmidt in San Francisco, California on August 21, 1919; she entered the BVM in Dubuque, Iowa on September 8, 1937, taking the name Sister Jean Dolores; and

WHEREAS, Sister Jean taught at several Catholic schools in Chicago, Los Angeles, California, and North Hollywood, California before coming to teach at Mundelein College in Chicago in 1961; over the next 30 years, she held numerous roles at Mundelein College until the educational institution affiliated with Loyola University Chicago in 1991; she engaged in an academic advisor role with the men's basketball team in 1993, and she later transitioned to the position of team chaplain; she long maintained a key role in supporting the Ramblers, offering both spiritual support and practical advice on the players' game performance; and

WHEREAS, Sister Jean, though long known for her many roles at Loyola University Chicago, became an international celebrity at the age of 98 during the 2018 NCAA March Madness tournament when she accompanied the Ramblers as they reached the Final Four for the first time since the program's historic 1963 national championship season; cheering for the team from the sidelines, her presence as team chaplain captured the attention of the media; she became one of the most talked-about topics of the 2018 tournament, and merchandise featuring her likeness and her motto of "Worship, Work, Win" sold swiftly; and

WHEREAS, Sister Jean, in addition to her work with the Ramblers, also held weekly prayer groups for students and started a program called SMILE (Students Moving Into the Lives of the Elderly), which paired Loyola students with residents of The Clare, an assisted living community on the Water Tower campus that she called home for many years; and

WHEREAS, Sister Jean co-authored her memoir, Wake Up with Purpose!: What I've Learned in My First Hundred Years, with Seth Davis, which was published in February 2023; and

WHEREAS, Sister Jean received a number of honors and accolades, including being inducted into the Loyola University

- 1 Chicago Athletics Hall of Fame in 2017 and awarded the Sword of
- 2 Loyola in 2018; she was further recognized by church and world
- 3 leaders for her joy and service; for her 100th birthday, she
- 4 received an Apostolic Blessing from Pope Francis; at her 103rd
- 5 birthday celebration on August 21, 2022, she received the
- 6 honor of the Loyola CTA Red Line plaza being renamed after her,
- 7 with proclamations from both Governor JB Pritzker and Chicago
- 8 Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot dedicating the day in her honor; on her
- 9 105th birthday, she received a proclamation from President Joe
- Biden in recognition of her lifetime of service; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Sister Jean was a woman of prayer, a dedicated
- 12 educator, and a bearer of hope who loved her BVM community; she
- 13 will be remembered as an invaluable source of wisdom, love,
- 14 compassion, and grace to generations of Loyola University
- 15 Chicago students, faculty, and staff; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Sister Jean was preceded in death by her parents
- and her brothers, Edward and Raymond Schmidt; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Sister Jean is survived by her sister-in-law,
- 19 Margaret Schmidt; her nieces and nephews; and her fellow BVM
- 20 sisters; therefore, be it
