SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

35 ILCS 200/6-15
35 ILCS 200/6-34

Amends the Property Tax Code. Provides that no more than 2 members of the board of review may be affiliated with the same political party (currently, 2 members of the board shall be affiliated with the political party polling the highest vote for any county office in the county). Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning revenue.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Property Tax Code is amended by changing
5 Sections 6-15 and 6-34 as follows:

6 (35 ILCS 200/6-15)

7 Sec. 6-15. Political makeup and compensation. The board of
8 review appointed under Section 6-5 shall consist of 3 members,
9 of which no more than 2 members may be of whom are affiliated
10 with the same political party ~~polling the highest vote for any~~
11 ~~county office in the county at the last general election prior~~
12 ~~to any appointment made under this Section. The third member~~
13 ~~shall not be affiliated with that same party.~~ Each member of
14 the board of review shall receive an annual salary to be fixed
15 by the county board and paid out of the county treasury.
