1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 1

Section 1. The sum of \$1,004,092,300, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Human Services for ordinary and contingent expenses of the department, permanent improvements and for student, member or inmate compensation expenses of the department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026.

Section 2. The amount of \$13,406,700, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Human Services for ordinary and contingent expenses associated with the Office of the Inspector General.

The Department, with the consent in writing from the Governor, may reapportion not more than 1 percent of the total appropriation of General Revenue Funds in Section 1 to Section 2 above among the various purposes therein enumerated.
