SENATE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened 3 to learn of the death of Less Boucher of Springfield, who 4 passed away on February 8, 2025; and

WHEREAS, Less Boucher was born to James Langston Boucher and Julia Gram Boucher in Springfield on October 9, 1954; he spent his early years in Girard before later moving to Virden; he graduated from Virden High School; he earned his political science degree from Knox College in Galesburg, where he played football and joined the Beta Theta Pi Fraternity; he continued his post-graduate studies with a focus on economics at the University of Illinois Springfield; he married Beth Prough in 1976; and

WHEREAS, Less Boucher was a dedicated public servant, spending a majority of his career working in the collection, organization, and distribution of labor market and employment information, along with employment and training development; he began his professional career as a planner with the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act program (CETA) in 1979, and at the age of 26, he was named executive director for the Land of Lincoln Consortium, the agency in charge of administering CETA and other programs for a multi-county area in Central Illinois; he later served as associate director for
