1 AN ACT concerning civil law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Public Duty Rule Codification Act.
- 6 Section 5. Findings; purpose.
- 7 (a) The General Assembly finds:
- 8 (1) On January 22, 2016, the Illinois Supreme Court, in 9 Coleman v. East Joliet Fire Protection District, 2016 IL 10 117952, abolished the public duty rule.
 - (2) The public duty rule is an important doctrine that is grounded in the principle that the duty of a local governmental entity to preserve the well-being of the community is owed to the public at large rather than to specific members of the community.
- 16 (b) It is the purpose of this Act to codify the public duty

- Section 10. Public duty rule. A local governmental entity and its employees owe no duty of care to individual members of the general public to provide governmental services.
