1 AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
- 5 Community Behavioral Health Care Professional Loan Repayment
- 6 Program Act.
- 7 Section 5. Purpose. The purpose of the Community Behavioral
- 8 Health Care Professional Loan Repayment Program is to recruit
- 9 and retain qualified mental health and substance use
- 10 professionals to practice in underserved or rural areas and to
- 11 address this State's community-based behavioral health care
- 12 workforce shortage that causes disparities in access to
- 13 critical mental health and substance use services.
- 14 Section 10. Definitions. In this Act:
- 15 "Commission" means the Illinois Student Assistance
- 16 Commission.
- 17 "Physician" means a person licensed by this State to
- 18 practice medicine in all its branches and includes any person
- 19 holding a temporary license, as provided in the Medical
- 20 Practice Act of 1987.
- 21 "Program" means the Community Behavioral Health Care
- 22 Professional Loan Repayment Program.

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- "Psychiatrist" or "licensed psychiatrist" means a

 physician who has successfully completed a residency program in

 psychiatry accredited by either the Accreditation Council for

 Graduate Medical Education or the American Osteopathic

 Association.
- 6 Section 15. Establishment of Program. Beginning on July 1, 7 2019, there is created the Community Behavioral Health Care 8 Professional Loan Repayment Program, which shall 9 administered by the Illinois Student Assistance Commission. 10 The Program shall provide loan repayment assistance, subject to 11 appropriation, to eligible mental health and substance use 12 professionals practicing in a community mental health center in an underserved or rural federally designated Mental Health 1.3 14 Professional Shortage Area.
 - Section 20. Applications. Each year, the Commission shall receive and consider applications for loan repayment assistance under this Act. All applications must be submitted to the Commission in a form and manner prescribed by the Commission. Applicants must submit any supporting documents deemed necessary by the Commission at the time of application.
- Section 25. Award; maximum loan time; maximum amount.

 Subject to appropriation, the Commission shall award a grant to

 each qualified applicant for a maximum of 4 years. The

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Commission must encourage the recipient of a grant awarded 1 2 under this Act to use the grant award for payments towards the 3 recipient's educational loans. The amount of the grant shall not exceed (i) \$35,000 per year for a psychiatrist, (ii) 5 \$15,000 per year for an advanced practice registered nurse or a physician assistant, (iii) \$12,000 per year for a psychologist 6 who holds a doctoral degree, (iv) \$6,500 per year for a 7 licensed clinical social worker or a licensed clinical 8 9 professional counselor, and (v) \$2,500 per year for a substance 10 use professional.

- 11 Section 30. Eligibility; work requirement.
- 12 (a) To be eligible for assistance under the Community
 13 Behavioral Health Care Professional Loan Repayment Program,
 14 the Commission must find that the applicant satisfies all of
 15 the following:
- 16 (1) He or she is a United States citizen or an eligible
 17 noncitizen.
- 18 (2) He or she is a resident of this State.
 - (3) He or she has worked for at least 12 consecutive months as a behavioral health professional in a community mental health center in an underserved or rural federally designated Mental Health Professional Shortage Area in this State.
 - (4) He or she is a borrower with an outstanding balance due on an educational loan.

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- 1 (5) He or she has not defaulted on an educational loan.
- 2 (b) The Commission may grant preference to a previous 3 recipient of a grant under the Program, provided that the 4 recipient continues to meet the eligibility requirements under 5 this Section.
 - (c) A recipient of a grant under the Program must complete a separate 12-month period working in a community mental health center in an underserved or rural federally designated Mental Health Professional Shortage Area in this State for each grant that he or she is awarded.
- Section 35. Administration; rules. The Commission shall administer the Program and shall adopt rules not inconsistent with this Act for the Program's effective implementation.
