Makes various appropriations to the Office of the State Comptroller for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. Effective July 1, 2018.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1-5. The sum of \$21,636,700, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated to meet the ordinary and
7 contingent expenses of the Office of the State Comptroller.

8 Section 1-10. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the State Comptroller
10 from the Comptroller's Administrative Fund for the discharge
11 of duties of the office.

12 Section 1-15. The sum of \$50,300, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated to the State Comptroller from
14 the State Lottery Fund for expenses in connection with the
15 State Lottery.

16 ARTICLE 5

17 Section 5-5. The following named sums, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
 2 hereinafter named, are appropriated to the Office of the State
 3 Comptroller for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019:
