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1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

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2 WHEREAS, Community policing, the system of allocating 3 police officers to particular areas so that they become 4 familiar with the local inhabitants, has become a popular 5 crime-fighting strategy across the country; and

WHEREAS, Community policing began in Chicago in 1993 with the CAPS program, which was designed to make residents active partners in preventing and reducing crime; the key strategy in CAPS is that police, businesses, and residents of a particular neighborhood have to work together to address the conditions that lead to crime; and

WHEREAS, Community policing is supported by a variety of strategies, including neighborhood beat officers, regular community meetings involving police and residents, extensive training for both police and the community, more efficient use of city services, and the use of new technology to target crime hot spots; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge police departments around the State to create a community liaison police officer program similar to CAPS, that designates a specific number of patrol officers as community partners and

- 2 advisory committees with members of the community and local
- 3 officials to discuss ways to improve public safety.
