- 9 (a) As used in this Section, "eligible individual" means a female child under the age of 18, and, beginning on January 1, 10 2020, a male child under the age of 18, who is a resident of 11 is not entitled to receive a human 12 Illinois who: (1)papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination at no cost as a benefit under 13 14 a plan of health insurance, a managed care plan, or a plan provided by a health maintenance organization, a health 15 16 services plan corporation, or a similar entity, and (2) meets 17 the requirements established by the Department of Public Health by rule. 18
 - (b) Subject to appropriation, the Department of Public Health shall establish and administer a program, commencing no later than July 1, 2011, under which any eligible individual shall, upon the eligible individual's request, receive a series of HPV vaccinations as medically indicated, at no cost to the

- 1 eligible individual.
- 2 (c) The Department of Public Health shall adopt rules for 3 the administration and operation of the program, including, but not limited to: determination of the HPV vaccine formulation to 5 be administered and the method of administration; eligibility requirements and eligibility determinations; and standards and 6 criteria for acquisition and distribution of the HPV vaccine 7 8 and related supplies. The Department may enter into contracts 9 agreements with public or private entities for the 10 performance of such duties under the program as the Department 11 may deem appropriate to carry out this Section and its rules 12 adopted under this Section.

 Act, beginning August 1, 2007, the Department of Public Health
 must provide all female students who are entering sixth grade
 and their parents or legal guardians written information about
 the link between human papillomavirus (HPV) and cervical,
 vulvar, vaginal, penile, anal, and oropharyngeal cancers in
 males and females, as applicable, and the availability of a HPV

- vaccine so that they may be protected before ever being exposed 1 2 to the virus cervical cancer and the availability of a HPV vaccine. 3
 - (b) The Director of Public Health shall prescribe the content of the information required in subsection (a) of this Section.
 - (c) In order to provide for the expeditious and timely implementation of the provisions of this amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly, the Department of Public Health shall adopt emergency rules in accordance with Section 5-45 of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act to the extent necessary to administer the Department's responsibilities under this amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly. The adoption of emergency rules authorized by this subsection (c) is deemed to be necessary for the public interest, safety, and welfare.
- 16 (d) In order to provide for the expeditious and timely 17 implementation of the provisions of this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly, the Department of Public Health shall 18 19 adopt emergency rules in accordance with Section 5-45 of the 20 Illinois Administrative Procedure Act to the extent necessary to administer the Department's responsibilities under this 21 22 amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly no later than July 23 1, 2019. The adoption of emergency rules authorized by this subsection (d) is deemed to be necessary for the public 24 25 interest, safety, and welfare.
