## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

25 ILCS 130/8A-35 25 ILCS 130/8A-60 new

Amends the Legislative Commission Reorganization Act of 1984. Provides for the acquisition and placement of statues depicting: (1) President Ronald W. Reagan; (2) President Barack H. Obama; (3) Governor James R. Thompson; and (4) State Representative and Illinois labor union leader Reuben G. Soderstrom at the State Capitol Building. Provides that the Architect of the Capitol may provide for the design and fabrication of the statues, or may otherwise acquire, using funds collected for such purpose or a statue donated to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, a suitable statue for placement. Requires the Architect of the Capitol to take actions necessary to provide for the placement and unveiling of the statues within specified periods of time. Requires the Architect of the Capitol to issue a report to the Governor and General Assembly detailing his or her actions in acquiring and placing the statues. Provides that the Capitol Restoration Trust Fund shall contain 4 separate accounts for the deposit of funds donated for the payment of expenses associated with the placement of the statues. Provides that the separate accounts may accept deposits from any source, whether private or public, and may be appropriated only for use by the Architect of the Capitol for expenses associated with the acquisition, placement, and maintenance of the statues. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Legislative Commission Reorganization Act
of 1984 is amended by changing Section 8A-35 and by adding
Section 8A-60 as follows:

7 (25 ILCS 130/8A-35)

8 Sec. 8A-35. Capitol Restoration Trust Fund; 9 appropriations.

(a) The Capitol Restoration Trust Fund is created as a
special fund within the State treasury. The Fund may accept
deposits from any source, whether private or public, and may be
appropriated only for the use of the Architect of the Capitol
in the performance of his or her powers and duties. The
Architect of the Capitol may seek private and public funds for
deposit into the Capitol Restoration Trust Fund.

17 <u>(a-5) The Capitol Restoration Trust Fund shall contain a</u> 18 separate account for the deposit of funds donated for the 19 payment of expenses associated with the placement of a 20 Presidential Statue at the State Capitol Building depicting 21 President Ronald W. Reagan, as provided under Section 8A-60. 22 The separate account may accept deposits from any source, 23 whether private or public, and may be appropriated only for use

1	by the Architect of the Capitol for expenses associated with
2	the acquisition, placement, and maintenance of the
3	Presidential Statue authorized under subsection (a) of Section
4	8A-60. The Architect of the Capitol may seek private and public
5	funds for deposit into the separate account of the Capitol
6	Restoration Trust Fund established under this subsection
7	<u>(a-5).</u>

8 (a-10) The Capitol Restoration Trust Fund shall contain a 9 separate account for the deposit of funds donated for the 10 payment of expenses associated with the placement of a 11 Presidential Statue at the State Capitol Building depicting 12 President Barack H. Obama, as provided under Section 8A-60. The 13 separate account may accept deposits from any source, whether 14 private or public, and may be appropriated only for use by the Architect of the Capitol for expenses associated with the 15 16 acquisition, placement, and maintenance of the Presidential 17 Statue authorized under subsection (b) of Section 8A-60. The Architect of the Capitol may seek private and public funds for 18 19 deposit into the separate account of the Capitol Restoration 20 Trust Fund established under this subsection (a-10).

21 <u>(a-15) The Capitol Restoration Trust Fund shall contain a</u> 22 <u>separate account for the deposit of funds donated for the</u> 23 <u>payment of expenses associated with the placement of a statue</u> 24 <u>at the State Capitol Building depicting Governor James R.</u> 25 <u>Thompson, as provided under Section 8A-60. The separate account</u> 26 <u>may accept deposits from any source, whether private or public,</u> HB0168

1 and may be appropriated only for use by the Architect of the 2 Capitol for expenses associated with the acquisition, 3 placement, and maintenance of the statue authorized under 4 subsection (c) of Section 8A-60. The Architect of the Capitol 5 may seek private and public funds for deposit into the separate 6 account of the Capitol Restoration Trust Fund established under 7 this subsection (a-15).

8 (a-20) The Capitol Restoration Trust Fund shall contain a 9 separate account for the deposit of funds donated for the 10 payment of expenses associated with the placement of a statue 11 at the State Capitol Building depicting State Representative 12 and Illinois labor union leader Reuben G. Soderstrom, as 13 provided under Section 8A-60. The separate account may accept 14 deposits from any source, whether private or public, and may be appropriated only for use by the Architect of the Capitol for 15 16 expenses associated with the acquisition, placement, and 17 maintenance of the statue authorized under subsection (d) of Section 8A-60. The Architect of the Capitol may seek private 18 19 and public funds for deposit into the separate account of the 20 Capitol Restoration Trust Fund established under this subsection (a-20). 21

(b) The Architect of the Capitol shall submit all budget requests to implement the master plan that relate to areas of the legislative complex other than the State Capitol Building to the Capitol Historic Preservation Board for review and comment. The Architect of the Capitol shall submit all budget

6	(a) The Architect of the Capitol, at the direction of the
7	Board of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, shall
8	provide for the acquisition and placement of a statue at the
9	State Capitol Building depicting 40th President of the United
10	States Ronald W. Reagan. The Architect of the Capitol may
11	provide for the design and fabrication of the statue, or may
12	otherwise acquire, using funds collected for such purpose or a
13	statue donated to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, a
14	suitable statue for placement under this Section.
15	(b) The Architect of the Capitol, at the direction of the
16	Board of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, shall
17	provide for the acquisition and placement of a statue at the
18	State Capitol Building depicting 44th President of the United
19	States Barack H. Obama. The Architect of the Capitol may
20	provide for the design and fabrication of the statue, or may
21	otherwise acquire, using funds collected for such purpose or a
22	statue donated to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, a
23	suitable statue for placement under this Section.
24	(c) The Architect of the Capitol, at the direction of the
25	Board of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, shall

provide for the acquisition and placement of a statue at the State Capitol Building depicting 37th Governor of the State of Illinois James R. Thompson. The Architect of the Capitol may provide for the design and fabrication of the statue, or may otherwise acquire, using funds collected for such purpose or a statue donated to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, a suitable statue for placement under this Section.

8 (d) The Architect of the Capitol, at the direction of the 9 Board of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, shall 10 provide for the acquisition and placement of a statue at the 11 State Capitol Building depicting State Representative and 12 Illinois labor union leader Reuben G. Soderstrom. The Architect of the Capitol may provide for the design and fabrication of 13 14 the statue, or may otherwise acquire, using funds collected for 15 such purpose or a statue donated to the Office of the Architect 16 of the Capitol, a suitable statue for placement under this 17 Section.

(e) The Architect of the Capitol, at the direction of the 18 19 Board of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, shall take 20 actions necessary to provide for the placement and unveiling of 21 the Presidential Statues authorized under subsections (a) and 22 (b) at the Capitol by February 15, 2021 (Presidents' Day). 23 Prior to the placement of the statues at the Capitol, the 24 Architect of the Capitol shall issue a report detailing his or 25 her actions in acquiring and placing the statues specified under this subsection (e). The report shall be delivered to the 26

1 Governor and the General Assembly on or before December 1, 2 2020. The report to the General Assembly shall be filed with 3 the Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of 4 the Senate in electronic form only, in the manner that the 5 Clerk and the Secretary shall direct.

6 (f) The Architect of the Capitol, at the direction of the 7 Board of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol, shall take 8 actions necessary to provide for the placement and unveiling of 9 the statues authorized under subsections (c) and (d) within a 10 reasonable period of time after the effective date of this 11 amendatory Act of the 101st General Assembly, except that, 12 notwithstanding the requirements of subsection (e), the statue 13 depicting Reuben G. Soderstrom shall be placed on Capitol 14 grounds before any other statue authorized under this Section. Prior to the placement of the statues at the Capitol, the 15 16 Architect of the Capitol shall issue a report detailing his or 17 her actions in acquiring and placing the statues specified under this subsection (f). The report shall be delivered to the 18 19 Governor and the General Assembly. The report to the General 20 Assembly shall be filed with the Clerk of the House of 21 Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate in electronic 22 form only, in the manner that the Clerk and the Secretary shall 23 direct.

24 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 25 becoming law.
