1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 1874 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 1874 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by adding 4 Section 6z-107 as follows: 5 6 (30 ILCS 105/6z-107 new)7 Sec. 6z-107. Roadside Memorial Fund. Money in the Roadside Memorial Fund, created by Public Act 96-667, shall be used by 8 the Department of Transportation to pay fees imposed under 9 10 subsection (f) of Section 20 of the Roadside Memorial Act, for veterans tombstone reimbursement, and for impaired driving 11 12 prevention programs. 85% of money deposited into the Roadside 13 Memorial Fund shall be distributed to the Department of Veterans' Affairs for tombstone reimbursement; 12% shall be 14

used for impaired driving probation programs; and 3% shall be

used for memorial markers on any State, municipal, township, or
