#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

50 ILCS 705/10.12

Amends the Illinois Police Training Act. Provides that all police dogs used by State and local law enforcement agencies for drug enforcement purposes under the Illinois Controlled Substances Act and the Methamphetamine Control and Community Protection Act shall be trained by programs that meet the minimum certification requirements set by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board or a national association qualified to certify working police dogs. Provides that on or after the effective date of the amendatory Act, notwithstanding any provision of law, police dogs used by State and local law enforcement agencies for drug enforcement purposes under the Cannabis Control Act may be trained by programs that meet the minimum certification requirements set by the Board or a national association qualified to certify working police dogs. Makes technical changes. Effective immediately.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Illinois Police Training Act is amended by  
5 changing Section 10.12 as follows:

6 (50 ILCS 705/10.12)

7 Sec. 10.12. Police dog training standards. All Beginning  
8 July 1, 2012, all police dogs used by State and local law  
9 enforcement agencies for drug enforcement purposes under  
10 pursuant to the Cannabis Control Act (720 ILCS 550/), the  
11 Illinois Controlled Substances Act (720 ILCS 570/), and the  
12 Methamphetamine Control and Community Protection Act (720 ILCS  
13 646/) shall be trained by programs that meet the minimum  
14 certification requirements set by the Board or a national  
15 association qualified to certify working police dogs. On or  
16 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 101st  
17 General Assembly, notwithstanding any provision of law, police  
18 dogs used by State and local law enforcement agencies for drug  
19 enforcement purposes under the Cannabis Control Act may be  
20 trained by programs that meet the minimum certification  
21 requirements set by the Board or a national association  
22 qualified to certify working police dogs.
