SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

35 ILCS 5/229 new

Amends the Illinois Income Tax Act. Creates an income tax credit in the amount of \$250 for taxpayers who (i) adopt an animal from a no kill animal shelter and (ii) retain ownership of the animal for a period of 6 consecutive months during the taxable year. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Income Tax Act is amended by adding
 Section 229 as follows:
- 6 (35 ILCS 5/229 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 229. Pet adoption credit.</u>
- (a) For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 8 9 2019, a taxpayer who (i) adopts an animal from a no kill animal shelter and (ii) retains ownership of the animal for a period 10 of 6 consecutive months during the taxable year is entitled to 11 12 a credit against the tax imposed by subsections (a) and (b) of Section 201 in the amount of \$250. As used in this Section, a 13 14 "no kill animal shelter" means an animal shelter where fewer than 10% of the animals received were euthanized in the 15 16 previous calendar year.

17 (b) If the amount of the credit exceeds the tax liability 18 for the year, the excess may be carried forward and applied to 19 the tax liability of the 5 tax years following the excess 20 credit year. The tax credit award shall be applied to the 21 earliest year for which there is a tax liability. If there are 22 credits from more than one tax year that are available to 23 offset liability, the earlier credit shall be applied first. In
