SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 140/2 5 ILCS 140/2.16 new

Amends the Freedom of Information Act. Provides that "public body" includes road districts. Defines "Freedom of Information officer" as an employee or official of a public body who is appointed by the public body and responsible for responding to all requests for information received by the public body. Provides that the Department of State Police shall furnish to a requester: (1) all information contained in the Law Enforcement Agencies Data System about the requester; and (2) every instance the name or vehicle registration information of the requester was queried and the name of the person making the inquiry. Provides that the information provided to a requester shall include all information contained in the Law Enforcement Agencies Data System relating to the requester, and is not limited to name and license plate information.

AN ACT concerning government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

Section 5. The Freedom of Information Act is amended by 4 changing Section 2 and by adding Section 2.16 as follows: 5

7 Sec. 2. Definitions. As used in this Act:

"Public body" means all legislative, executive, 8 (a) 9 administrative, or advisory bodies of the State, state universities and colleges, counties, townships, 10 road 11 districts, cities, villages, incorporated towns, school districts and all other municipal corporations, boards, 12 bureaus, committees, or commissions of this State, any 13 14 subsidiary bodies of any of the foregoing including but not limited to committees and subcommittees thereof, and a School 15 16 Finance Authority created under Article 1E of the School Code. "Public body" does not include a child death review team or the 17 Illinois Child Death Review Teams 18 Executive Council 19 established under the Child Death Review Team Act, or a 20 regional youth advisory board or the Statewide Youth Advisory 21 Board established under the Department of Children and Family 22 Services Statewide Youth Advisory Board Act.

"Person" means any 23 (b) individual, corporation,

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partnership, firm, organization or association, acting
 individually or as a group.

(c) "Public records" means all records, reports, forms, 3 letters, memoranda, books, 4 writings, papers, maps, 5 photographs, microfilms, cards, tapes, recordings, electronic 6 data processing records, electronic communications, recorded information and all other documentary materials pertaining to 7 8 the transaction of public business, regardless of physical form 9 or characteristics, having been prepared by or for, or having 10 been or being used by, received by, in the possession of, or 11 under the control of any public body.

12 (c-5) "Private information" means unique identifiers, 13 including a person's social security number, driver's license number, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, 14 personal financial information, passwords or other access 15 16 codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, and 17 personal email addresses. Private information also includes home address and personal license plates, except as otherwise 18 provided by law or when compiled without possibility of 19 20 attribution to any person.

(c-10) "Commercial purpose" means the use of any part of a public record or records, or information derived from public records, in any form for sale, resale, or solicitation or advertisement for sales or services. For purposes of this definition, requests made by news media and non-profit, scientific, or academic organizations shall not be considered

to be made for a "commercial purpose" when the principal purpose of the request is (i) to access and disseminate information concerning news and current or passing events, (ii) for articles of opinion or features of interest to the public, or (iii) for the purpose of academic, scientific, or public research or education.

7 (d) "Copying" means the reproduction of any public record 8 by means of any photographic, electronic, mechanical or other 9 process, device or means now known or hereafter developed and 10 available to the public body.

(e) "Head of the public body" means the president, mayor, chairman, presiding officer, director, superintendent, manager, supervisor or individual otherwise holding primary executive and administrative authority for the public body, or such person's duly authorized designee.

(f) "News media" means a newspaper or other periodical issued at regular intervals whether in print or electronic format, a news service whether in print or electronic format, a radio station, a television station, a television network, a community antenna television service, or a person or corporation engaged in making news reels or other motion picture news for public showing.

(g) "Recurrent requester", as used in Section 3.2 of this Act, means a person that, in the 12 months immediately preceding the request, has submitted to the same public body (i) a minimum of 50 requests for records, (ii) a minimum of 15

requests for records within a 30-day period, or (iii) a minimum 1 2 of 7 requests for records within a 7-day period. For purposes 3 of this definition, requests made by news media and non-profit, scientific, or academic organizations shall not be considered 4 5 in calculating the number of requests made in the time periods in this definition when the principal purpose of the requests 6 7 is (i) to access and disseminate information concerning news and current or passing events, (ii) for articles of opinion or 8 9 features of interest to the public, or (iii) for the purpose of 10 academic, scientific, or public research or education.

For the purposes of this subsection (g), "request" means a written document (or oral request, if the public body chooses to honor oral requests) that is submitted to a public body via personal delivery, mail, telefax, electronic mail, or other means available to the public body and that identifies the particular public record the requester seeks. One request may identify multiple records to be inspected or copied.

(h) "Voluminous request" means a request that: (i) includes 18 more than 5 individual requests for more than 5 different 19 20 categories of records or a combination of individual requests that total requests for more than 5 different categories of 21 22 records in a period of 20 business days; or (ii) requires the 23 compilation of more than 500 letter or legal-sized pages of public records unless a single requested record exceeds 500 24 pages. "Single requested record" may include, but is not 25 26 limited to, one report, form, e-mail, letter, memorandum, book,

1 map, microfilm, tape, or recording.

2 "Voluminous request" does not include a request made by 3 news media and non-profit, scientific, or academic organizations if the principal purpose of the request is: (1) 4 5 to access and disseminate information concerning news and current or passing events; (2) for articles of opinion or 6 features of interest to the public; or (3) for the purpose of 7 8 academic, scientific, or public research or education.

9 For the purposes of this subsection (h), "request" means a 10 written document, or oral request, if the public body chooses 11 to honor oral requests, that is submitted to a public body via 12 personal delivery, mail, telefax, electronic mail, or other 13 means available to the public body and that identifies the particular public record or records the requester seeks. One 14 request may identify multiple individual records to be 15 16 inspected or copied.

(i) "Severance agreement" means a mutual agreement between any public body and its employee for the employee's resignation in exchange for payment by the public body.

20 (j) "Freedom of Information officer" means an employee or 21 official of a public body who is appointed by the public body 22 and responsible for responding to all requests for information 23 received by the public body.
