## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

410 ILCS 35/18 new 410 ILCS 35/20

from Ch. 111 1/2, par. 3751-20

Amends the Equitable Restrooms Act. Provides that all restrooms that are open and accessible to the public in a public building shall be equipped with baby changing facilities that are physically safe, sanitary, and usable for that purpose. Provides that the requirement is in addition to any accommodations that may be made for individuals in accordance with any local, State, or federal laws regarding access for persons with disabilities and to existing fire, health, and safety codes or standards. Defines "public building". Makes a conforming change.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Equitable Restrooms Act is amended by changing Section 20 and by adding Section 18 as follows:

- Sec. 20. Application. This Act applies only to places of public accommodation that commence construction, or that commence alterations exceeding 50% of the entire place of public accommodation, after the effective date of this Act.

  Section 18 also applies to any restroom that is open and accessible to the public in a public building, as that term is defined in Section 18.
