#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Appropriates various amounts to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives for General Assembly operations. Effective July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The sum of \$13,091,050, or so much thereof as  
5 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
6 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
7 Representatives for furnishing the items provided in Section 4  
8 of the General Assembly Compensation Act to members of their  
9 respective houses throughout the year in connection with their  
10 legislative duties and responsibilities and not in connection  
11 with any political campaign as prescribed by law. Of this  
12 amount, 37.436% is appropriated to the President of the Senate  
13 for such expenditures and 62.564% is appropriated to the  
14 Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

15 Section 10. Payments from the sums appropriated in Section  
16 5 shall be made only upon the delivery of a voucher approved  
17 by the member to the State Comptroller. The voucher shall also  
18 be approved by the President of the Senate or the Speaker of  
19 the House of Representatives as the case may be.

21 Section 15. The sum of \$20,603,400, or so much thereof as  
22 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to meet the

1 ordinary and incidental expenses of the Senate legislative  
2 leadership and legislative staff assistants and the House  
3 Majority and Minority leadership staff, general staff, and  
4 office operations. Of this amount, 25.7% is appropriated to the  
5 President of the Senate for such expenditures, 25.7% is  
6 appropriated to the Senate Minority Leader for such  
7 expenditures, 24.8% is appropriated to the Speaker of the House  
8 for such expenditures, and 23.8% is appropriated to the House  
9 Minority Leader for such expenditures.

10 Section 20. The sum of \$9,882,100, or so much thereof as  
11 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
12 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
13 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses of  
14 committees, the general staff and operations, per diem  
15 employees, special and standing committees, and expenses  
16 incurred in transcribing and printing of debates. Of this  
17 amount, 43.018% is appropriated to the President of the Senate  
18 for such expenditures and 56.982% is appropriated to the  
19 Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

20 Section 25. The sum of \$309,200, or so much thereof as may  
21 be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the President  
22 of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives  
23 for the ordinary and incidental expenses, also including the

1 purchasing on contract as required by law of printing, binding,  
2 printing paper, stationery and office supplies. For the House,  
3 no part of which shall be expended for expenses of purchasing,  
4 handling, or distributing such supplies and against which no  
5 indebtedness shall be incurred without the written approval of  
6 the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Of this amount,  
7 69.277% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for such  
8 expenditures and 30.723% is appropriated to the Speaker of the  
9 House for such expenditures.

10 Section 30. The sum of \$6,483,050, or so much thereof as  
11 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
12 President of the Senate for the use of standing committees for  
13 expert witnesses, technical services, consulting assistance,  
14 and other research assistance associated with special studies  
15 and long range research projects which may be requested by the  
16 standing committees and the Speaker of the House of  
17 Representatives for Standing House Committees pursuant to the  
18 Legislative Commission Reorganization Act of 1984. Of this  
19 amount, 46.862% is appropriated to the President of the Senate  
20 for such expenditures and 53.138% is appropriated to the  
21 Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

22 Section 35. The sum of \$167,000, or so much thereof as may  
23 be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the President

1 of the Senate and the Senate Minority Leader for allowances for  
2 the particular and additional services appertaining to or  
3 entailed by the respective officers of the Senate. Of this  
4 amount, 50% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for  
5 such expenditures and 50% is appropriated to the Senate  
6 Minority Leader for such expenditures.

7 Section 40. The sum of \$88,100, or so much thereof as may  
8 be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the President  
9 of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives  
10 for travel, including expenses to Springfield of members on  
11 official legislative business during weeks when the General  
12 Assembly is not in Session. Of this amount, 65.5% is  
13 appropriated to the President of the Senate for such  
14 expenditures and 34.5% is appropriated to the Speaker of the  
15 House of Representatives for such expenditures.

16 Section 45. The sum of \$341,600, or so much thereof as may  
17 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to  
18 the General Assembly to meet ordinary and contingent expenses.  
19 Any use of funds appropriated under this Section must be  
20 approved jointly by the Clerk of the House of Representatives  
21 and the Secretary of the Senate.

22 Section 50. As used in Section 15 hereof, except where the

1 approval of the Speaker of the House of Representatives is  
2 expressly required for the expenditure of or the incurring of  
3 indebtedness against an appropriation for certain purchases on  
4 contract, "Speaker" means the leader of the party having the  
5 largest number of members of the House of Representatives as  
6 of January 9, 2019, and "Minority Leader" means the leader of  
7 the party having the second largest number of members of the  
8 House of Representatives as of January 9, 2019.

9 Section 55. The sum of \$113,700, or so much thereof as may  
10 be necessary, is appropriated for the ordinary and contingent  
11 expenses of the Senate Operations Commission including the  
12 planning costs, construction costs, moving expenses, and all  
13 other costs associated with the construction and reconstruction  
14 of Senate offices in the Capitol Complex area.

15 Section 60. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may  
16 be necessary, respectively, is appropriated from the General  
17 Assembly Operations Revolving Fund to the President of the  
18 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives to meet  
19 ordinary and contingent expenses. Of this amount, 50% is  
20 appropriated to the President of the Senate for such  
21 expenditures and 50% is appropriated to the Speaker of the  
22 House of Representatives for such expenditures.

1 Section 65. The following named sums, or so much thereof  
 2 as may be necessary and remain unexpended from an appropriation  
 3 made for such purposes in Section 70 of Article 89 of Public  
 4 Act 100-0021, as amended, are re-appropriated from the General  
 5 Revenue Fund for expenses in connection with the planning and  
 6 preparation of redistricting of Legislative and Representative  
 7 Districts as required by Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois  
 8 Constitution of 1970:

9	To the Senate President .....	500,000
10	To the Senate Minority Leader .....	<u>500,000</u>
11	Total	\$1,000,000

12 Section 70. The following named sums, or so much thereof as  
 13 may be necessary and remain unexpended from an appropriation  
 14 hereto made for such purposes in Section 70 of Article 59 of  
 15 Public Act 100-0586, as amended, are re-appropriated from the  
 16 General Revenue Fund for expenses in connection with the  
 17 planning and preparation of redistricting of Legislative and  
 18 Representative Districts as required by Article IV, Section 3  
 19 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970:

20	To the House Speaker .....	500,000
21	To the House Minority Leader .....	<u>500,000</u>
22	Total	\$1,000,000

1 Section 75. The sum of \$441,600, or so much thereof as may  
 2 be necessary and remains unexpended from an appropriation made  
 3 for such purposes in Section 75 of Article 59 of Public Act  
 4 100-0586, as amended, is reappropriated to the Speaker of the  
 5 House for expenses in connection with the planning and  
 6 preparation of redistricting of legislative and representative  
 7 districts as required by Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois  
 8 Constitution on 1970.

9 Section 80. The following named sums, or so much thereof as  
 10 may be necessary, are appropriated from the General Revenue  
 11 Fund for expenses in connection with the planning and  
 12 preparation of redistricting of Legislative and Representative  
 13 Districts as required by Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois  
 14 Constitution of 1970:

15	To the Senate President .....	250,000
16	To the Senate Minority Leader .....	<u>250,000</u>
17	Total	\$500,000

18 Section 85. The following named sums, or so much thereof as  
 19 may be necessary, are appropriated from the General Revenue  
 20 Fund for expenses in connection with the planning and  
 21 preparation of redistricting of Legislative and Representative



1 Districts as required by Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois  
2 Constitution of 1970:

3	To the House Speaker .....	250,000
4	To the House Minority Leader .....	<u>250,000</u>
5	Total	\$500,000

6 Section 90. The sum of \$365,000, or so much thereof as may  
7 be necessary and remains unexpended from an appropriation made  
8 for such purposes in Section 90 of Article 59 of Public Act  
9 100-0586, as amended, is re-appropriated from the General  
10 Revenue Fund to the Speaker of the House of Representatives to  
11 meet ordinary and contingent expenses, including, but not  
12 limited to, the replacement of audio system equipment for the  
13 House Chamber.

14 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,  
15 2019.
