SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

775 ILCS 5/1-102

from Ch. 68, par. 1-102

Amends the Illinois Human Rights Act. Provides that it is the public policy of the State to secure for all individuals within Illinois the freedom from discrimination against any individual because of his or her political affiliation.

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1 AN ACT concerning human rights.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Human Rights Act is amended by 5 changing Section 1-102 as follows:

6 (775 ILCS 5/1-102) (from Ch. 68, par. 1-102)

Sec. 1-102. Declaration of Policy. It is the public policyof this State:

9 (A) Freedom from Unlawful Discrimination. To secure for all individuals within Illinois the freedom from discrimination 10 against any individual because of his or her race, color, 11 12 religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, order of 13 protection status, marital status, physical or mental 14 disability, military status, sexual orientation, pregnancy, political affiliation, or unfavorable discharge from military 15 16 service in connection with employment, real estate 17 transactions, access to financial credit, and the availability of public accommodations. 18

(B) Freedom from Sexual Harassment-Employment and Elementary, Secondary, and Higher Education. To prevent sexual harassment in employment and sexual harassment in elementary, secondary, and higher education.

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(C) Freedom from Discrimination Based on Citizenship

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Status-Employment. To prevent discrimination based on
 citizenship status in employment.

3 (D) Freedom from Discrimination Based on Familial
4 Status-Real Estate Transactions. To prevent discrimination
5 based on familial status in real estate transactions.

6 (E) Public Health, Welfare and Safety. To promote the 7 public health, welfare and safety by protecting the interest of 8 all people in Illinois in maintaining personal dignity, in 9 realizing their full productive capacities, and in furthering 10 their interests, rights and privileges as citizens of this 11 State.

(F) Implementation of Constitutional Guarantees. To secure
and guarantee the rights established by Sections 17, 18 and 19
of Article I of the Illinois Constitution of 1970.

(G) Equal Opportunity, Affirmative Action. To establish 15 16 Equal Opportunity and Affirmative Action as the policies of 17 this State in all of its decisions, programs and activities, and to assure that all State departments, boards, commissions 18 19 and instrumentalities rigorously take affirmative action to 20 provide equality of opportunity and eliminate the effects of past discrimination in the internal affairs of State government 21 22 and in their relations with the public.

(H) Unfounded Charges. To protect citizens of this State
 against unfounded charges of unlawful discrimination, sexual
 harassment in employment and sexual harassment in elementary,
 secondary, and higher education, and discrimination based on
