#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/10-20.73 new  
105 ILCS 5/34-18.66 new

Amends the School Code. Requires school districts with a population of 3,000 or more students to interview a minimum percentage of minority candidates for teaching positions. Exempts teaching positions within an English as a Second Language program from the requirement. Sets forth the formula for the school district to use to calculate the minimum percentage required. Provides that if the school district is unable to interview the required minimum percentage of minority candidates for 2 consecutive years, the school district must implement a program for school district employees interested in obtaining a Professional Educator License. Effective immediately.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Sections  
5 10-20.73 and 34-18.66 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/10-20.73 new)

7 Sec. 10-20.73. Minimum percentage of minority teaching  
8 candidates.

9 (a) During the process of interviewing candidates for a  
10 teaching position, a school district with a population of 3,000  
11 or more students must interview a minimum percentage of  
12 minority candidates for the position as provided in this  
13 subsection (a). The minimum percentage requirement does not  
14 apply to teaching positions in an English as a Second Language  
15 program. The minimum percentage is calculated by subtracting  
16 10% from the percentage of minority students enrolled in the  
17 school district. A school district that is unable to interview  
18 the required minimum percentage of minority candidates for 2  
19 consecutive years must establish a program to assist minority  
20 employees of the school district who are interested in  
21 obtaining a Professional Educator License under Section 21B-20  
22 of this Code.

23 (b) To facilitate the implementation of the program that

1 may be required under subsection (a), a school district is  
2 encouraged to collaborate with an Illinois institution of  
3 higher education that offers an approved educator preparation  
4 program. The program established by the school district under  
5 subsection (a) must:

6 (1) provide minority employees with information about  
7 the educator preparation program;

8 (2) assist minority employees in enrolling in the  
9 educator preparation program;

10 (3) offer flexible work hours for an employee to  
11 complete the educator preparation program; and

12 (4) provide financial incentives to encourage minority  
13 employees to obtain a Professional Educator License.

14 (c) A program developed by a school district under  
15 subsection (a) must be submitted to and approved by the State  
16 Board of Education prior to implementation of the program.

18 Sec. 34-18.66. Minimum percentage of minority teaching  
19 candidates.

20 (a) During the process of interviewing candidates for a  
21 teaching position, the school district must interview a minimum  
22 percentage of minority candidates for the position as provided  
23 in this subsection (a). The minimum percentage requirement does  
24 not apply to teaching positions in an English as a Second  
25 Language program. The minimum percentage is calculated by

1 subtracting 10% from the percentage of minority students  
2 enrolled in the school district. If the school district is  
3 unable to interview the required minimum percentage of minority  
4 candidates for 2 consecutive years, the school district must  
5 establish a program to assist minority employees of the school  
6 district who are interested in obtaining a Professional  
7 Educator License under Section 21B-20 of this Code.

8 (b) To facilitate the implementation of the program that  
9 may be required under subsection (a), the school district is  
10 encouraged to collaborate with an Illinois institution of  
11 higher education that offers an approved educator preparation  
12 program. The program established by the school district under  
13 subsection (a) must:

14 (1) provide minority employees with information about  
15 the educator preparation program;

16 (2) assist minority employees in enrolling in the  
17 educator preparation program;

18 (3) offer flexible work hours for an employee to  
19 complete the educator preparation program; and

20 (4) provide financial incentives to encourage minority  
21 employees to obtain a Professional Educator License.

22 (c) A program developed by the school district under  
23 subsection (a) must be submitted to and approved by the State  
24 Board of Education prior to implementation of the program.

25 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon  
26 becoming law.
