## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Illinois Municipal Code and School Code. Requires the State Board of Elections to create a voter registration affidavit that shall be the exclusive means by which a noncitizen of the United States may register to vote in municipal and school board elections. Provides that the elections conducted under the provisions are considered non-State elections and not subject to the citizenship requirement in the Illinois Constitution. Provides what the individual shall attest to in the voter registration affidavit. Provides that the voter registration affidavit shall be valid for one municipal or school board election. Provides the notice that shall appear in the voter registration affidavit.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Municipal Code is amended by 5 changing Sections 1-1-2 and 7-1-1.1 and adding Section 1-9-10 6 as follows:

7 (65 ILCS 5/1-1-2) (from Ch. 24, par. 1-1-2)

8 Sec. 1-1-2. Definitions. In this Code:

9 (1) "Municipal" or "municipality" means a city, village, or incorporated town in the State of Illinois, but, unless the 10 context otherwise provides, "municipal" or "municipality" does 11 not include a township, town when used as the equivalent of a 12 13 township, incorporated town that has superseded a civil 14 township, county, school district, park district, sanitary district, or any other similar governmental district. If 15 16 "municipal" or "municipality" is given a different definition in any particular Division or Section of this Act, that 17 definition shall control in that division or Section only. 18

19 (2) "Corporate authorities" means (a) the mayor and 20 aldermen or similar body when the reference is to cities, (b) 21 the president and trustees or similar body when the reference 22 is to villages or incorporated towns, and (c) the council when 23 the reference is to municipalities under the commission form of 1 municipal government.

2 (3) "Electors" means persons qualified to vote for elective
3 officers at municipal elections <u>or a person qualified to vote</u>
4 under Section 1-9-10.

5 (4) "Person" means any individual, partnership, 6 corporation, joint stock association, or the State of Illinois 7 or any subdivision of the State; and includes any trustee, 8 receiver, assignee, or personal representative of any of those 9 entities.

10 (5) Except as otherwise provided by ordinance, "fiscal 11 year" in all municipalities with fewer than 500,000 12 inhabitants, and "municipal year" in all municipalities, means the period elapsing (a) between general municipal elections in 13 succeeding calendar years, or (b) if general municipal 14 elections are held biennially, then between a general municipal 15 16 election and the same day of the same month of the following 17 calendar year, and between that day and the next succeeding general municipal election, or (c) if general municipal 18 elections are held quadrennially, then between a general 19 20 municipal election and the same day of the same month of the following calendar year, and between that day and the same day 21 22 of the same month of the next following calendar year, and 23 between the last mentioned day and the same day of the same 24 month of the next following calendar year, and between the last 25 mentioned day and the next succeeding general municipal 26 election. The fiscal year of each municipality with 500,000 or

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1 more inhabitants shall commence on January 1.

2 (6) Where reference is made to a county within which a 3 municipality, district, area, or territory is situated, the 4 reference is to the county within which is situated the major 5 part of the area of that municipality, district, area, or 6 territory, in case the municipality, district, area, or 7 territory is situated in 2 or more counties.

8 (7) Where reference is made for any purpose to any other 9 Act, either specifically or generally, the reference shall be 10 to that Act and to all amendments to that Act now in force or 11 that may be hereafter enacted.

12 (8) Wherever the words "city council", "aldermen", 13 "commissioners", or "mayor" occur, the provisions containing 14 these words shall apply to the board of trustees, trustees, and 15 president, respectively, of villages and incorporated towns 16 and councilmen in cities, so far as those provisions are 17 applicable to them.

18 (9) The terms "special charter" and "special Act" are 19 synonymous.

(10) "General municipal election" means the biennial regularly scheduled election for the election of officers of cities, villages, and incorporated towns, as prescribed by the general election law; in the case of municipalities that elect officers annually, "general municipal election" means each regularly scheduled election for the election of officers of cities, villages, and incorporated towns. 3	Sec. 1-9-10. Noncitizen registration for municipal
4	elections.
5	(a) The State Board of Elections shall create a voter
6	registration affidavit that shall be the exclusive means by
7	which a noncitizen of the United States may register to vote in
8	municipal elections. Registration affidavits shall be filed
9	with a municipality's clerk.
10	Elections conducted under this Section, for the purpose of
11	Section 1 of Article III of the Illinois Constitution, are
12	considered non-State elections and are not subject to the
13	citizenship requirement of that Section.
14	Upon request, a voter may obtain a ballot listing only
15	offices to be elected under this Section.
16	(b) The voter registration affidavit shall, in addition to
17	any other information required by the State Board of Elections,
18	require the individual to attest under penalty of perjury that:
19	(1) the individual is not a United States citizen;
20	(2) the individual is a resident within the boundaries
21	of a municipality and intends to remain a resident within
22	those boundaries until the next municipal election;
23	(3) at the time of the next municipal election, the
24	individual will be at least 18 years old; and
25	(4) the individual is not otherwise disqualified from

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1	voting under Section 2 of Article III of the Illinois
2	Constitution.
3	The voter registration affidavit shall also state that it
4	does not entitle an individual to vote for candidates in any
5	other election other than municipal elections, except if
6	registered for school board elections under Section 9-3 of the
7	School Code.
8	(c) An individual's voter registration affidavit shall be
9	valid for one municipal election. An individual must submit a
10	new voter registration affidavit prior to voting in each
11	municipal election.
12	(d) The voter registration affidavit shall include the
13	following notice:
14	"IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR NONCITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES. Any
15	information you provide to the municipality, including your
16	name and address, may be obtained by Immigration and Customs
17	Enforcement (ICE) and other agencies, organizations, and
18	individuals. In addition, if you apply for naturalization, you
19	will be asked whether you have ever registered or voted in a
20	federal, state, or local election in the United States. You may
21	wish to consult with an immigration attorney, an organization
22	that protects immigrant rights, or other knowledgeable source
23	before registering to vote in a local municipal election.".
24	(e) The notice in subsection (d) shall appear in
25	conspicuous type in contrast by typography, layout, or color
26	with all other words on each document or website where the

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1	notice appears. The words "IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR NONCITIZENS OF
2	THE UNITED STATES" shall appear in capital letters. The notice
3	shall be included on both the State Board of Elections' and the
4	municipality's websites.

7	"elector" means anyone registered to vote or a person qualified
8	to vote under Section 1-9-10.

10	Section 10. The School Code is amended by changing Section
11	9-2 and by adding Section 9-3 as follows:
12	(105 ILCS 5/9-2) (from Ch. 122, par. 9-2)
13	Sec. 9-2. Election Definitions. As used in this Act in
14	connection with elections of school officials and referenda:
15	(a) "Voter" or "Legal voter" or "elector" means a person
16	qualified to vote under the general election law <u>or a person</u>
17	qualified to vote under Section 9-3.
18	(b) "Certify" and "certification", when used in connection
19	with elections of officers or referenda, refers to the
20	certification in accordance with the general election law of
21	offices, candidates or propositions to county clerks and boards
22	of election commissioners for inclusion on the ballot at an
23	election.

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1 (c) "Submit" and "submission" when used in connection with 2 a referendum on a proposition or question refers to the 3 submission to the voters in accordance with the general 4 election law of the proposition or question by county clerks 5 and boards of election commissioners.

6 (d) "Local election official" means the secretary of a 7 board of education, the secretary or clerk of a board of school 8 directors, the treasurer of a township board of school 9 trustees, the secretary of township land commissioners and the 10 regional superintendent of schools with respect to the various 11 school officer elections and school referenda for which the 12 regional superintendent is assigned election duties pursuant 13 to this Code.

16 <u>Sec. 9-3. Noncitizen registration for school board</u> 17 <u>elections.</u>

18 <u>(a) The State Board of Elections shall create a voter</u> 19 registration affidavit that shall be the exclusive means by 20 which a noncitizen of the United States may register to vote in 21 school board elections. Registration affidavits shall be filed 22 with a local board of education.

Elections conducted under this Section, for the purpose of Section 1 of Article III of the Illinois Constitution, are considered non-State elections and are not subject to the

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1	citizenship requirement of that Section.
2	Upon request, a voter may obtain a ballot listing only
3	offices to be elected under this Section.
4	(b) The voter registration affidavit shall, in addition to
5	any other information required by the State Board of Education,
6	require the individual to attest under penalty of perjury that:
7	(1) the individual is not a United States citizen;
8	(2) the individual is a resident within the boundaries
9	of a school district and intends to remain a resident
10	within those boundaries until the next school board
11	election;
12	(3) the individual is a parent, legal guardian, or
13	caregiver of a child who, at the time of the next school
14	board election, will be under age 19 and resides within the
15	boundaries of a school district;
16	(4) at the time of the next school board election, the
17	individual will be at least 18 years old; and
18	(5) the individual is not otherwise disqualified from
19	voting under Section 2 of Article III of the Illinois
20	Constitution.
21	The voter registration affidavit shall also state that it
22	does not entitle an individual to vote for candidates in any
23	other election other than school board elections, except if
24	registered for municipal elections under Section 1-9-10 of the
25	Illinois Municipal Code.
26	(c) An individual's voter registration affidavit shall be

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1	valid for one school board election. An individual must submit
2	a new voter registration affidavit prior to voting in each
3	school board election.
4	(d) The voter registration affidavit shall include the
5	following notice:
6	"IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR NONCITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES. Any
7	information you provide to the local board of education,
8	including your name and address, may be obtained by Immigration
9	and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and other agencies,
10	organizations, and individuals. In addition, if you apply for
11	naturalization, you will be asked whether you have ever
12	registered or voted in a federal, state, or local election in
13	the United States. You may wish to consult with an immigration
14	attorney, an organization that protects immigrant rights, or
15	other knowledgeable source before registering to vote in a
16	local school board election.".
17	(e) The notice in subsection (d) shall appear in
18	conspicuous type in contrast by typography, layout, or color
19	with all other words on each document or website where the
20	notice appears. The words "IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR NONCITIZENS OF
21	THE UNITED STATES" shall appear in capital letters. The notice
22	shall be included on both the State Board of Elections' and a
23	local school board's websites.
