SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

230 ILCS 45/25-30

Amends the Sports Wagering Act. Provides that to be issued a master sports wagering license, an organization licensee under the Illinois Horse Racing Act of 1975 shall: (1) have entered into a signed contract with the horsemen's association representing the largest number of owners, trainers, jockeys, or standardbred drivers who race horses at the race meeting of the organization licensee that covers the entire term of a master sports wagering license and the conditions at which the organization gaming licensee would conduct sports wagering, including, but not limited to, providing services for backstretch workers; and (2) have been issued an organization gaming license the same requirements in order to renew the master sports wagering license. Effective immediately.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- 4 Section 5. The Sports Wagering Act is amended by changing 5 Section 25-30 as follows:
- (230 ILCS 45/25-30) 6

7 Sec. 25-30. Master sports wagering license issued to an 8 organization licensee.

9 (a) An organization licensee may apply to the Board for a master sports wagering license. On and after the effective date 10 of this amendatory Act of the 101st General Assembly, the Board 11 12 shall only issue a master sports wagering license to an organization licensee that: (1) has entered into a signed 13 14 contract with the horsemen's association representing the largest number of owners, trainers, jockeys, or standardbred 15 16 drivers who race horses at the race meeting of the organization 17 licensee that covers the entire term of a master sports wagering license and the conditions at which the organization 18 19 gaming licensee would conduct sports wagering, including, but 20 not limited to, providing services for backstretch workers; and 21 (2) has been issued an organization gaming license under the 22 Illinois Gambling Act. To the extent permitted by federal and State law, the Board shall actively seek to achieve racial, 23

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ethnic, and geographic diversity when issuing master sports 1 wagering licenses to organization licensees and encourage 2 3 minority-owned businesses, women-owned businesses, veteran-owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with 4 5 disabilities to apply for licensure. Additionally, the report published under subsection (m) of Section 25-45 shall impact 6 7 the issuance of the master sports wagering license to the 8 extent permitted by federal and State law.

9 For the purposes of this subsection (a), "minority-owned 10 business", "women-owned business", and "business owned by 11 persons with disabilities" have the meanings given to those 12 terms in Section 2 of the Business Enterprise for Minorities, 13 Women, and Persons with Disabilities Act.

14 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection (b), 15 the initial license fee for a master sports wagering license 16 for an organization licensee is 5% of its handle from the 17 preceding calendar year or the lowest amount that is required to be paid as an initial license fee by an owners licensee 18 under subsection (b) of Section 25-35, whichever is greater. No 19 20 initial license fee shall exceed \$10,000,000. An organization licensee licensed on the effective date of this Act shall pay 21 22 the initial master sports wagering license fee by July 1, 2020. 23 For an organization licensee licensed after the effective date 24 of this Act, the master sports wagering license fee shall be \$5,000,000, but the amount shall be adjusted 12 months after 25 26 the organization licensee begins racing operations based on 5%

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of its handle from the first 12 months of racing operations.
 The master sports wagering license is valid for 4 years.

3 (c) The organization licensee may renew the master sports wagering license for a period of 4 years by paying a \$1,000,000 4 5 renewal fee to the Board. To renew the master sports wagering license, an organization licensee shall: (1) have entered into 6 7 a signed contract with the horsemen's association representing 8 the largest number of owners, trainers, jockeys, or 9 standardbred drivers who race horses at the race meeting of the 10 organization licensee that covers the entire term of a master 11 sports wagering license and the conditions at which the 12 organization gaming licensee would conduct sports wagering, 13 including, but not limited to, providing services for 14 backstretch workers; and (2) have been issued an organization gaming license under the Illinois Gambling Act. 15

16 (d) An organization licensee issued a master sports 17 wagering license may conduct sports wagering:

(1) at its facility at which inter-track wagering is
conducted pursuant to an inter-track wagering license
under the Illinois Horse Racing Act of 1975;

(2) at 3 inter-track wagering locations if the inter-track wagering location licensee from which it derives its license is an organization licensee that is issued a master sports wagering license; and

(3) over the Internet or through a mobile application.
(e) The sports wagering offered over the Internet or

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through a mobile application shall only be offered under either the same brand as the organization licensee is operating under or a brand owned by a direct or indirect holding company that owns at least an 80% interest in that organization licensee on the effective date of this Act.

6 (f) Until issuance of the first license under Section 7 25-45, an individual must create a sports wagering account in 8 person at a facility under paragraph (1) or (2) of subsection 9 (d) to participate in sports wagering offered over the Internet 10 or through a mobile application.
