## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Illinois Amateur Sports Commission Act. Provides that the purpose of the Commission is to advise and to make recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly regarding the promotion, development, expansion, and fostering of amateur sports, amateur sports programs, and amateur sporting events throughout the State. Sets forth the areas of study that the Commission must examine. Sets forth the membership of the Commission. Contains provisions concerning meetings and reporting. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning State government.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Illinois Amateur Sports Commission Act.

6 Section 5. Illinois Amateur Sports Commission; purpose;
7 duties.

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(a) The Illinois Amateur Sports Commission is created.

9 (b) The purpose of the Commission is to research, study, 10 and to make recommendations to the Governor and the General 11 Assembly about the promotion, development, expansion, and 12 fostering of amateur sports, amateur sports programs, and 13 amateur sporting events throughout the State.

14 (c) Recommendations made by the Commission shall focus generally on the promotion and encouragement of physical 15 16 fitness through the participation in amateur sports and amateur 17 sports programs and on the development of local and statewide business opportunities and economic development relating to 18 19 amateur sports, amateur sports programs, competitions, and 20 events. The recommendations reported by the Commission to the 21 Governor and General Assembly shall include, but are not 22 limited to, the following objectives:

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(1) To provide workshops, training, and conferences to

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schools and communities throughout the State to increase
 youth participation in amateur sports and amateur sports
 programs.

4 (2) To connect public, private, local, and State 5 entities to generate funding for amateur sports programs 6 and to facilitate the communication of information 7 statewide about amateur sports programs and events.

8 (3) To support the development of and investment in an
9 Olympic Training Center in the State.

10 (4) To promote the participation of community amateur
 11 sports programs in national and international amateur
 12 athletic competitions and events.

13 (5) To encourage the inclusion and participation of 14 persons with disabilities in amateur sports and amateur 15 sports programs.

16 Section 10. Membership.

17 (a) The Commission shall include the following members:

18 (1) Four members appointed by the Governor who have
 19 recognized experience in promoting, organizing, or
 20 administering amateur sports programs or other athletic
 21 organizations.

(2) Two members appointed by the Governor who areOlympians and who participated in youth sports.

24 (3) One member of the Senate appointed by the President25 of the Senate.

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(4) One member of the Senate appointed by the Minority
 Leader of the Senate.

(5) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

5 (6) One member of the House of Representatives 6 appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of 7 Representatives.

8 (7) One member appointed by the Governor who represents
9 an Illinois high school athletic association.

10 (8) One member appointed by the Governor who represents11 an Illinois collegiate athletic association.

(9) Eleven members appointed by the Governor who shall
individually represent one category of the following
amateur youth sports, but shall as a group represent all of
the following categories of amateur youth sports:

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(B) Basketball.

(C) Cheerleading or gymnastics.

19(D) Cross country running or other track and field20sports.

21 (E) Football.

(F) Golf.

23 (G) Hockey.

24 (H) Soccer.

25 (I) Softball.

26 (J) Swimming.

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#### (K) Volleyball.

2 (b) More than 4 members of the General Assembly may be 3 appointed to serve on the Commission as long as the number of 4 members appointed at any time, except during a vacancy, 5 represent equally each of the majority and minority caucuses of 6 each house.

7 (c) The Governor shall select the chairperson of the8 Council from among the members.

9 Section 15. Terms; meetings; support; expenses.

(a) Each member of the Commission shall be appointed for a
2-year term, or until his or her successor is appointed. The
Governor may stagger the members' terms to ensure continuity in
the performance of the Commission's responsibilities.

(b) The Commission shall meet initially within 30 days after the effective date of this Act, and at least quarterly thereafter, at the times and places in this State that the Commission designates.

18 (c) The Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity 19 shall provide administrative and other support to the 20 Commission.

(d) Members of the Commission shall receive no compensation for their participation, but may be reimbursed by the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for expenses in connection with their participation, including travel, subject to the rules of the appropriate travel control board, if funds HB5819 - 5 - LRB101 21846 CMG 72805 b

2 Section 20. Reporting. The Commission shall submit a report 3 of its findings, research, and recommendations to the Governor 4 and the General Assembly on or before December 31, 2022 and 5 thereafter on an annual basis.

6 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon7 becoming law.
