1 AN ACT concerning finance.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by adding Sections 5.891 and 6z-107 as follows:
- 6 (30 ILCS 105/5.891 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 5.891. The Cook County Water Infrastructure Fund.</u>
- 8 (30 ILCS 105/6z-107 new)
- 9 Sec. 6z-107. Water supplies from Lake Michigan.
- 10 (a) As used in this Section:
- "Non-supplying municipality in Cook County" means a

  municipality in Cook County that receives its water from
- 13 <u>another municipality and does not sell its water to another</u>
- 14 <u>municipality</u>.
- "Supplying municipality in Cook County" means a
  municipality in Cook County that either receives water directly
- 17 from Lake Michigan or buys its water from another municipality
- and then sells some of its water to another municipality.
- 19 (b) The Cook County Water Infrastructure Fund is created as
- a special fund in the State treasury. Subject to appropriation,
- 21 moneys in the Fund shall be used by the Environmental
- 22 Protection Agency to make grants to municipalities to fund

- infrastructure improvements to facilitate water supplies from 1
- 2 Lake Michigan for residents of Cook County.
- 3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Cook County
- 4 Water Infrastructure Fund is not subject to sweeps,
- administrative charges or chargebacks, or any other fiscal or 5
- 6 budgetary maneuver that would in any way transfer any funds
- from the Cook County Water Infrastructure Fund into any other 7
- 8 fund of the State.
- 9 (c) In making grants from the Cook County Water
- 10 Infrastructure Fund, the Agency must prioritize water
- 11 infrastructure projects in non-supplying municipalities in
- 12 Cook County over water infrastructure projects in supplying
- 13 municipalities in Cook County.
- (d) The Environmental Protection Agency may adopt rules 14
- under the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act to implement 15
- 16 this Section.
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 17
- becoming law. 18
