SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the General Provisions and State Employees Articles of the Illinois Pension Code. Provides that the alternative retirement annuity under the State Employees Article applies to a conservation police officer subject to the Tier 2 provisions. Provides that a conservation police officer subject to the Tier 2 provisions may convert up to 8 years of service credit established before the effective date of the amendatory Act as a conservation police officer under the State Employees Article into eligible creditable service by filing a written election with the Board under that Article, accompanied by a specified payment. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by changing
Sections 1-160 and 14-110 as follows:

6 (40 ILCS 5/1-160)

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Sec. 1-160. Provisions applicable to new hires.

8 (a) The provisions of this Section apply to a person who, 9 on or after January 1, 2011, first becomes a member or a participant under any reciprocal retirement system or pension 10 fund established under this Code, other than a retirement 11 12 system or pension fund established under Article 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 13 15 or 18 of this Code, notwithstanding any other provision of 14 this Code to the contrary, but do not apply to any self-managed plan established under this Code, to any person with respect to 15 16 service as a sheriff's law enforcement employee under Article 7, or to any participant of the retirement plan established 17 under Section 22-101. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary 18 19 in this Section, for purposes of this Section, a person who 20 participated in a retirement system under Article 15 prior to 21 January 1, 2011 shall be deemed a person who first became a 22 member or participant prior to January 1, 2011 under any retirement system or pension fund subject to this Section. The 23

changes made to this Section by Public Act 98-596 are a
 clarification of existing law and are intended to be
 retroactive to January 1, 2011 (the effective date of Public
 Act 96-889), notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1-103.1
 of this Code.

6 This Section does not apply to a person who first becomes a 7 noncovered employee under Article 14 on or after the 8 implementation date of the plan created under Section 1-161 for 9 that Article, unless that person elects under subsection (b) of 10 Section 1-161 to instead receive the benefits provided under 11 this Section and the applicable provisions of that Article.

12 This Section does not apply to a person who first becomes a 13 member or participant under Article 16 on or after the 14 implementation date of the plan created under Section 1-161 for 15 that Article, unless that person elects under subsection (b) of 16 Section 1-161 to instead receive the benefits provided under 17 this Section and the applicable provisions of that Article.

This Section does not apply to a person who elects under subsection (c-5) of Section 1-161 to receive the benefits under Section 1-161.

This Section does not apply to a person who first becomes a member or participant of an affected pension fund on or after 6 months after the resolution or ordinance date, as defined in Section 1-162, unless that person elects under subsection (c) of Section 1-162 to receive the benefits provided under this Section and the applicable provisions of the Article under SB0208 - 3 - LRB101 05036 RPS 50046 b

1 which he or she is a member or participant.

2 (b) "Final average salary" means the average monthly (or 3 annual) salary obtained by dividing the total salary or earnings calculated under the Article applicable to the member 4 5 or participant during the 96 consecutive months (or 8 consecutive years) of service within the last 120 months (or 10 6 7 years) of service in which the total salary or earnings 8 calculated under the applicable Article was the highest by the 9 number of months (or years) of service in that period. For the 10 purposes of a person who first becomes a member or participant 11 of any retirement system or pension fund to which this Section 12 applies on or after January 1, 2011, in this Code, "final average salary" shall be substituted for the following: 13

14 (1) In Article 7 (except for service as sheriff's law
 15 enforcement employees), "final rate of earnings".

16 (2) In Articles 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12, "highest average
17 annual salary for any 4 consecutive years within the last
18 10 years of service immediately preceding the date of
19 withdrawal".

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(3) In Article 13, "average final salary".

(4) In Article 14, "final average compensation".

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(5) In Article 17, "average salary".

23 (6) In Section 22-207, "wages or salary received by him
24 at the date of retirement or discharge".

(b-5) Beginning on January 1, 2011, for all purposes under
 this Code (including without limitation the calculation of

benefits and employee contributions), the annual earnings, 1 2 salary, or wages (based on the plan year) of a member or participant to whom this Section applies shall not exceed 3 \$106,800; however, that amount shall annually thereafter be 4 5 increased by the lesser of (i) 3% of that amount, including all previous adjustments, or (ii) one-half the annual unadjusted 6 7 percentage increase (but not less than zero) in the consumer price index-u for the 12 months ending with the September 8 9 preceding each November 1, including all previous adjustments.

10 For the purposes of this Section, "consumer price index-u" 11 means the index published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of 12 the United States Department of Labor that measures the average 13 change in prices of goods and services purchased by all urban 14 consumers, United States city average, all items, 1982-84 = 15 100. The new amount resulting from each annual adjustment shall 16 be determined by the Public Pension Division of the Department 17 of Insurance and made available to the boards of the retirement systems and pension funds by November 1 of each year. 18

(c) A member or participant is entitled to a retirement annuity upon written application if he or she has attained age (beginning January 1, 2015, age 65 with respect to service under Article 12 of this Code that is subject to this Section) and has at least 10 years of service credit and is otherwise eligible under the requirements of the applicable Article.

A member or participant who has attained age 62 (beginning January 1, 2015, age 60 with respect to service under Article

1 12 of this Code that is subject to this Section) and has at 2 least 10 years of service credit and is otherwise eligible 3 under the requirements of the applicable Article may elect to 4 receive the lower retirement annuity provided in subsection (d) 5 of this Section.

6 (c-5) A person who first becomes a member or a participant 7 under Article 8 or Article 11 of this Code on or after the 8 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General 9 Assembly, notwithstanding any other provision of this Code to 10 the contrary, is entitled to a retirement annuity upon written 11 application if he or she has attained age 65 and has at least 12 10 years of service credit under Article 8 or Article 11 of this Code and is otherwise eligible under the requirements of 13 14 Article 8 or Article 11 of this Code, whichever is applicable.

15 (d) The retirement annuity of a member or participant who 16 is retiring after attaining age 62 (beginning January 1, 2015, 17 age 60 with respect to service under Article 12 of this Code that is subject to this Section) with at least 10 years of 18 service credit shall be reduced by one-half of 1% for each full 19 20 month that the member's age is under age 67 (beginning January 1, 2015, age 65 with respect to service under Article 12 of 21 22 this Code that is subject to this Section).

(d-5) The retirement annuity of a person who first becomes a member or a participant under Article 8 or Article 11 of this Code on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly who is retiring at age 60 with at

least 10 years of service credit under Article 8 or Article 11 shall be reduced by one-half of 1% for each full month that the member's age is under age 65.

4 (d-10) Each person who first became a member or participant
5 under Article 8 or Article 11 of this Code on or after January
6 1, 2011 and prior to the effective date of this amendatory Act
7 of the 100th General Assembly shall make an irrevocable
8 election either:

9 (i) to be eligible for the reduced retirement age 10 provided in subsections (c-5) and (d-5) of this Section, 11 the eligibility for which is conditioned upon the member or 12 participant agreeing to the increases in employee contributions for age and service annuities provided in 13 14 subsection (a-5) of Section 8-174 of this Code (for service under Article 8) or subsection (a-5) of Section 11-170 of 15 16 this Code (for service under Article 11); or

17 (ii) to not agree to item (i) of this subsection (d-10), in which case the member or participant shall 18 19 continue to be subject to the retirement age provisions in 20 subsections (c) and (d) of this Section and the employee 21 contributions for age and service annuity as provided in 22 subsection (a) of Section 8-174 of this Code (for service 23 under Article 8) or subsection (a) of Section 11-170 of this Code (for service under Article 11). 24

The election provided for in this subsection shall be made between October 1, 2017 and November 15, 2017. A person subject

to this subsection who makes the required election shall remain bound by that election. A person subject to this subsection who fails for any reason to make the required election within the time specified in this subsection shall be deemed to have made the election under item (ii).

(e) Any retirement annuity or supplemental annuity shall be 6 7 subject to annual increases on the January 1 occurring either 8 on or after the attainment of age 67 (beginning January 1, 9 2015, age 65 with respect to service under Article 12 of this 10 Code that is subject to this Section and beginning on the 11 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General 12 Assembly, age 65 with respect to persons who: (i) first became members or participants under Article 8 or Article 11 of this 13 Code on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 14 15 the 100th General Assembly; or (ii) first became members or participants under Article 8 or Article 11 of this Code on or 16 17 after January 1, 2011 and before the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly and made the 18 election under item (i) of subsection (d-10) of this Section) 19 or the first anniversary of the annuity start date, whichever 20 is later. Each annual increase shall be calculated at 3% or 21 22 one-half the annual unadjusted percentage increase (but not 23 less than zero) in the consumer price index-u for the 12 months 24 ending with the September preceding each November 1, whichever 25 is less, of the originally granted retirement annuity. If the 26 annual unadjusted percentage change in the consumer price

1 index-u for the 12 months ending with the September preceding 2 each November 1 is zero or there is a decrease, then the 3 annuity shall not be increased.

For the purposes of Section 1-103.1 of this Code, the changes made to this Section by this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly are applicable without regard to whether the employee was in active service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly.

9 The initial survivor's or widow's annuity of an (f) 10 otherwise eligible survivor or widow of a retired member or 11 participant who first became a member or participant on or 12 after January 1, 2011 shall be in the amount of 66 2/3% of the 13 retired member's or participant's retirement annuity at the 14 date of death. In the case of the death of a member or 15 participant who has not retired and who first became a member 16 or participant on or after January 1, 2011, eligibility for a 17 survivor's or widow's annuity shall be determined by the applicable Article of this Code. The initial benefit shall be 18 19 66 2/3% of the earned annuity without a reduction due to age. A 20 child's annuity of an otherwise eligible child shall be in the amount prescribed under each Article if applicable. Any 21 22 survivor's or widow's annuity shall be increased (1) on each 23 January 1 occurring on or after the commencement of the annuity if the deceased member died while receiving a retirement 24 25 annuity or (2) in other cases, on each January 1 occurring 26 after the first anniversary of the commencement of the annuity.

Each annual increase shall be calculated at 3% or one-half the 1 2 annual unadjusted percentage increase (but not less than zero) 3 in the consumer price index-u for the 12 months ending with the September preceding each November 1, whichever is less, of the 4 5 originally granted survivor's annuity. Ιf the annual unadjusted percentage change in the consumer price index-u for 6 7 the 12 months ending with the September preceding each November 8 1 is zero or there is a decrease, then the annuity shall not be 9 increased.

10 (q) The benefits in Section 14-110 apply only if the person 11 is a State policeman, a fire fighter in the fire protection 12 service of a department, a conservation police officer, a security employee of the Department of Corrections or the 13 14 Department of Juvenile Justice, or a security employee of the 15 Department of Innovation and Technology, as those terms are 16 defined in subsection (b) and subsection (c) of Section 14-110. 17 A person who meets the requirements of this Section is entitled to an annuity calculated under the provisions of Section 18 19 14-110, in lieu of the regular or minimum retirement annuity, 20 only if the person has withdrawn from service with not less than 20 years of eligible creditable service and has attained 21 22 age 60, regardless of whether the attainment of age 60 occurs 23 while the person is still in service.

(h) If a person who first becomes a member or a participant
of a retirement system or pension fund subject to this Section
on or after January 1, 2011 is receiving a retirement annuity

or retirement pension under that system or fund and becomes a 1 2 member or participant under any other system or fund created by 3 this Code and is employed on a full-time basis, except for those members or participants exempted from the provisions of 4 5 this Section under subsection (a) of this Section, then the person's retirement annuity or retirement pension under that 6 7 system or fund shall be suspended during that employment. Upon 8 termination of that employment, the person's retirement 9 annuity or retirement pension payments shall resume and be 10 recalculated if recalculation is provided for under the 11 applicable Article of this Code.

If a person who first becomes a member of a retirement 12 13 system or pension fund subject to this Section on or after 14 January 1, 2012 and is receiving a retirement annuity or 15 retirement pension under that system or fund and accepts on a 16 contractual basis a position to provide services to a 17 governmental entity from which he or she has retired, then that person's annuity or retirement pension earned as an active 18 19 employee of the employer shall be suspended during that service. A person receiving an 20 contractual annuity or retirement pension under this Code shall notify the pension 21 22 fund or retirement system from which he or she is receiving an 23 annuity or retirement pension, as well as his or her 24 contractual employer, of his or her retirement status before 25 accepting contractual employment. A person who fails to submit 26 such notification shall be quilty of a Class A misdemeanor and

1 required to pay a fine of \$1,000. Upon termination of that 2 contractual employment, the person's retirement annuity or 3 retirement pension payments shall resume and, if appropriate, 4 be recalculated under the applicable provisions of this Code.

6 (j) In the case of a conflict between the provisions of 7 this Section and any other provision of this Code, the 8 provisions of this Section shall control.

12 Sec. 14-110. Alternative retirement annuity.

(a) Any member who has withdrawn from service with not less 13 14 than 20 years of eligible creditable service and has attained 15 age 55, and any member who has withdrawn from service with not 16 less than 25 years of eligible creditable service and has attained age 50, regardless of whether the attainment of either 17 18 of the specified ages occurs while the member is still in 19 service, shall be entitled to receive at the option of the 20 member, in lieu of the regular or minimum retirement annuity, a 21 retirement annuity computed as follows:

(i) for periods of service as a noncovered employee: if
retirement occurs on or after January 1, 2001, 3% of final
average compensation for each year of creditable service;
if retirement occurs before January 1, 2001, 2 1/4% of

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final average compensation for each of the first 10 years of creditable service, 2 1/2% for each year above 10 years to and including 20 years of creditable service, and 2 3/4% for each year of creditable service above 20 years; and

5 (ii) for periods of eligible creditable service as a covered employee: if retirement occurs on or after January 6 1, 2001, 2.5% of final average compensation for each year 7 of creditable service; if retirement occurs before January 8 9 1, 2001, 1.67% of final average compensation for each of 10 the first 10 years of such service, 1.90% for each of the next 10 years of such service, 2.10% for each year of such 11 12 service in excess of 20 but not exceeding 30, and 2.30% for 13 each year in excess of 30.

Such annuity shall be subject to a maximum of 75% of final average compensation if retirement occurs before January 1, 2001 or to a maximum of 80% of final average compensation if retirement occurs on or after January 1, 2001.

18 These rates shall not be applicable to any service 19 performed by a member as a covered employee which is not 20 eligible creditable service. Service as a covered employee 21 which is not eligible creditable service shall be subject to 22 the rates and provisions of Section 14-108.

(b) For the purpose of this Section, "eligible creditable service" means creditable service resulting from service in one or more of the following positions:

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(1) State policeman;

1	(2) fire fighter in the fire protection service of a
2	department;
3	(3) air pilot;
4	(4) special agent;
5	(5) investigator for the Secretary of State;
6	(6) conservation police officer;
7	(7) investigator for the Department of Revenue or the
8	Illinois Gaming Board;
9	(8) security employee of the Department of Human
10	Services;
11	(9) Central Management Services security police
12	officer;
13	(10) security employee of the Department of
14	Corrections or the Department of Juvenile Justice;
15	(11) dangerous drugs investigator;
16	(12) investigator for the Department of State Police;
17	(13) investigator for the Office of the Attorney
18	General;
19	(14) controlled substance inspector;
20	(15) investigator for the Office of the State's
21	Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor;
22	(16) Commerce Commission police officer;
23	(17) arson investigator;
24	(18) State highway maintenance worker;
25	(19) security employee of the Department of Innovation
26	and Technology; or

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(20) transferred employee.

2 A person employed in one of the positions specified in this subsection is entitled to eligible creditable service for 3 service credit earned under this Article while undergoing the 4 5 basic police training course approved by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board, if completion of that 6 7 training is required of persons serving in that position. For 8 the purposes of this Code, service during the required basic 9 police training course shall be deemed performance of the 10 duties of the specified position, even though the person is not 11 a sworn peace officer at the time of the training.

12 A person under paragraph (20) is entitled to eligible 13 creditable service for service credit earned under this Article 14 on and after his or her transfer by Executive Order No. 15 2003-10, Executive Order No. 2004-2, or Executive Order No. 16 2016-1.

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(c) For the purposes of this Section:

(1) The term "State policeman" includes any title or
position in the Department of State Police that is held by
an individual employed under the State Police Act.

(2) The term "fire fighter in the fire protection
service of a department" includes all officers in such fire
protection service including fire chiefs and assistant
fire chiefs.

(3) The term "air pilot" includes any employee whose
 official job description on file in the Department of

1 Central Management Services, or in the department by which 2 he is employed if that department is not covered by the 3 Personnel Code, states that his principal duty is the operation of aircraft, and who possesses a pilot's license; 4 5 however, the change in this definition made by this 6 amendatory Act of 1983 shall not operate to exclude any 7 noncovered employee who was an "air pilot" for the purposes 8 of this Section on January 1, 1984.

9 (4) The term "special agent" means any person who by 10 reason of employment by the Division of Narcotic Control, 11 the Bureau of Investigation or, after July 1, 1977, the 12 Division of Criminal Investigation, the Division of Internal Investigation, the Division of Operations, or any 13 14 other Division or organizational entity in the Department 15 of State Police is vested by law with duties to maintain 16 public order, investigate violations of the criminal law of 17 this State, enforce the laws of this State, make arrests and recover property. The term "special agent" includes any 18 19 title or position in the Department of State Police that is 20 held by an individual employed under the State Police Act.

(5) The term "investigator for the Secretary of State"
means any person employed by the Office of the Secretary of
State and vested with such investigative duties as render
him ineligible for coverage under the Social Security Act
by reason of Sections 218(d)(5)(A), 218(d)(8)(D) and
218(1)(1) of that Act.

1 A person who became employed as an investigator for the 2 Secretary of State between January 1, 1967 and December 31, 3 1975, and who has served as such until attainment of age 60, either continuously or with a single break in service 4 5 of not more than 3 years duration, which break terminated before January 1, 1976, shall be entitled to have his 6 7 annuity calculated in retirement accordance with 8 subsection (a), notwithstanding that he has less than 20 9 years of credit for such service.

10 (6) The term "Conservation Police Officer" means any 11 person employed by the Division of Law Enforcement of the 12 Department of Natural Resources and vested with such law enforcement duties as render him ineligible for coverage 13 14 under the Social Security Act by reason of Sections 15 218(d)(5)(A), 218(d)(8)(D), and 218(1)(1) of that Act. The term "Conservation Police Officer" includes the positions 16 17 of Chief Conservation Police Administrator and Assistant Conservation Police Administrator. 18

19 (7) The term "investigator for the Department of 20 Revenue" means any person employed by the Department of 21 Revenue and vested with such investigative duties as render 22 him ineligible for coverage under the Social Security Act 23 by reason of Sections 218(d)(5)(A), 218(d)(8)(D) and 24 218(1)(1) of that Act.

25The term "investigator for the Illinois Gaming Board"26means any person employed as such by the Illinois Gaming

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Board and vested with such peace officer duties as render the person ineligible for coverage under the Social Security Act by reason of Sections 218(d)(5)(A), 218(d)(8)(D), and 218(1)(1) of that Act.

5 (8) The term "security employee of the Department of 6 Human Services" means any person employed by the Department 7 of Human Services who (i) is employed at the Chester Mental 8 Health Center and has daily contact with the residents 9 thereof, (ii) is employed within a security unit at a 10 facility operated by the Department and has daily contact 11 with the residents of the security unit, (iii) is employed 12 at a facility operated by the Department that includes a security unit and is regularly scheduled to work at least 13 14 50% of his or her working hours within that security unit, 15 or (iv) is a mental health police officer. "Mental health 16 police officer" means any person employed by the Department 17 Human Services in a position pertaining to the of Department's mental health and developmental disabilities 18 19 functions who is vested with such law enforcement duties as 20 render the person ineligible for coverage under the Social 21 Security Act by reason of Sections 218(d)(5)(A), 22 218(d)(8)(D) and 218(l)(1) of that Act. "Security unit" 23 means that portion of a facility that is devoted to the 24 care, containment, and treatment of persons committed to 25 the Department of Human Services as sexually violent 26 persons, persons unfit to stand trial, or persons not

1 guilty by reason of insanity. With respect to past 2 employment, references to the Department of Human Services 3 include its predecessor, the Department of Mental Health 4 and Developmental Disabilities.

5 The changes made to this subdivision (c)(8) by Public 6 Act 92-14 apply to persons who retire on or after January 7 1, 2001, notwithstanding Section 1-103.1.

8 (9) "Central Management Services security police 9 officer" means any person employed by the Department of 10 Central Management Services who is vested with such law 11 enforcement duties as render him ineligible for coverage 12 under the Social Security Act by reason of Sections 13 218(d)(5)(A), 218(d)(8)(D) and 218(l)(1) of that Act.

14 (10) For a member who first became an employee under 15 this Article before July 1, 2005, the term "security 16 employee of the Department of Corrections or the Department 17 of Juvenile Justice" means any employee of the Department of Corrections or the Department of Juvenile Justice or the 18 19 former Department of Personnel, and any member or employee 20 of the Prisoner Review Board, who has daily contact with 21 inmates or youth by working within a correctional facility 22 or Juvenile facility operated by the Department of Juvenile 23 Justice or who is a parole officer or an employee who has 24 direct contact with committed persons in the performance of 25 his or her job duties. For a member who first becomes an 26 employee under this Article on or after July 1, 2005, the

term means an employee of the Department of Corrections or 1 the Department of Juvenile Justice who is any of the 2 3 following: (i) officially headquartered at a correctional facility or Juvenile facility operated by the Department of 4 Juvenile Justice, (ii) a parole officer, (iii) a member of 5 the apprehension unit, (iv) a member of the intelligence 6 7 unit, (v) a member of the sort team, or (vi) an 8 investigator.

9 (11) The term "dangerous drugs investigator" means any 10 person who is employed as such by the Department of Human 11 Services.

(12) The term "investigator for the Department of State
Police" means a person employed by the Department of State
Police who is vested under Section 4 of the Narcotic
Control Division Abolition Act with such law enforcement
powers as render him ineligible for coverage under the
Social Security Act by reason of Sections 218(d)(5)(A),
218(d)(8)(D) and 218(1)(1) of that Act.

19 (13) "Investigator for the Office of the Attorney 20 General" means any person who is employed as such by the 21 Office of the Attorney General and is vested with such 22 investigative duties as render him ineligible for coverage 23 under the Social Security Act by reason of Sections 24 218(d)(5)(A), 218(d)(8)(D) and 218(l)(1) of that Act. For 25 the period before January 1, 1989, the term includes all 26 persons who were employed as investigators by the Office of

1 the Attorney General, without regard to social security 2 status.

(14) "Controlled substance inspector" means any person 3 who is employed as such by the Department of Professional 4 Regulation and is vested with such law enforcement duties 5 as render him ineligible for coverage under the Social 6 7 Security Act by reason of Sections 218(d)(5)(A), 8 218(d)(8)(D) and 218(1)(1) of that Act. The term 9 "controlled substance inspector" includes the Program 10 Executive of Enforcement and the Assistant Program 11 Executive of Enforcement.

12 (15) The term "investigator for the Office of the 13 State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor" means a person 14 employed in that capacity on a full time basis under the 15 authority of Section 7.06 of the State's Attorneys 16 Appellate Prosecutor's Act.

(16) "Commerce Commission police officer" means any person employed by the Illinois Commerce Commission who is vested with such law enforcement duties as render him ineligible for coverage under the Social Security Act by reason of Sections 218(d)(5)(A), 218(d)(8)(D), and 218(1)(1) of that Act.

(17) "Arson investigator" means any person who is
employed as such by the Office of the State Fire Marshal

A person who was 3 employed as an arson investigator on January 1, 1995 and is no longer in service but not yet receiving a retirement 4 5 annuity may convert his or her creditable service for 6 employment as an arson investigator into eligible 7 creditable service by paying to the System the difference 8 between the employee contributions actually paid for that 9 service and the amounts that would have been contributed if 10 the applicant were contributing at the rate applicable to 11 persons with the same social security status earning 12 eligible creditable service on the date of application.

13 (18) The term "State highway maintenance worker" means14 a person who is either of the following:

15 (i) A person employed on a full-time basis by the 16 Illinois Department of Transportation in the position 17 highway maintainer, highway maintenance lead of worker, highway maintenance lead/lead worker, heavy 18 19 construction equipment operator, power shovel 20 operator, or bridge mechanic; and whose principal 21 responsibility is to perform, on the roadway, the 22 actual maintenance necessary to keep the highways that 23 form a part of the State highway system in serviceable condition for vehicular traffic. 24

(ii) A person employed on a full-time basis by the
 Illinois State Toll Highway Authority in the position

(19) The term "security employee of the Department of Innovation and Technology" means a person who was a security employee of the Department of Corrections or the Department of Juvenile Justice, was transferred to the Department of Innovation and Technology pursuant to Executive Order 2016-01, and continues to perform similar job functions under that Department.

19 (20) "Transferred employee" means an employee who was 20 transferred to the Department of Central Management 21 Services by Executive Order No. 2003-10 or Executive Order 22 No. 2004-2 or transferred to the Department of Innovation 23 and Technology by Executive Order No. 2016-1, or both, and 24 was entitled to eligible creditable service for services 25 immediately preceding the transfer.

26 (d) A security employee of the Department of Corrections or

the Department of Juvenile Justice, a security employee of the Department of Human Services who is not a mental health police officer, and a security employee of the Department of Innovation and Technology shall not be eligible for the alternative retirement annuity provided by this Section unless he or she meets the following minimum age and service requirements at the time of retirement:

8 (i) 25 years of eligible creditable service and age 55; 9 or

(ii) beginning January 1, 1987, 25 years of eligible
creditable service and age 54, or 24 years of eligible
creditable service and age 55; or

(iii) beginning January 1, 1988, 25 years of eligible
creditable service and age 53, or 23 years of eligible
creditable service and age 55; or

16 (iv) beginning January 1, 1989, 25 years of eligible
17 creditable service and age 52, or 22 years of eligible
18 creditable service and age 55; or

(v) beginning January 1, 1990, 25 years of eligible
creditable service and age 51, or 21 years of eligible

(vi) beginning January 1, 1991, 25 years of eligible
creditable service and age 50, or 20 years of eligible
creditable service and age 55.

25 Persons who have service credit under Article 16 of this 26 Code for service as a security employee of the Department of

Corrections or the Department of Juvenile Justice, or the 1 2 Services in a Department of Human position requiring 3 certification as a teacher may count such service toward establishing their eligibility under the service requirements 4 5 of this Section; but such service may be used only for establishing such eligibility, and not for the purpose of 6 7 increasing or calculating any benefit.

8 (e) If a member enters military service while working in a position in which eligible creditable service may be earned, 9 and returns to State service in the same or another such 10 position, and fulfills in all other respects the conditions 11 12 prescribed in this Article for credit for military service, 13 such military service shall be credited as eligible creditable service for the purposes of the retirement annuity prescribed 14 15 in this Section.

16 (f) For purposes of calculating retirement annuities under 17 this Section, periods of service rendered after December 31, 1968 and before October 1, 1975 as a covered employee in the 18 position of special agent, conservation police officer, mental 19 20 health police officer, or investigator for the Secretary of State, shall be deemed to have been service as a noncovered 21 22 employee, provided that the employee pays to the System prior 23 to retirement an amount equal to (1) the difference between the employee contributions that would have been required for such 24 service as a noncovered employee, and the amount of employee 25 contributions actually paid, plus (2) if payment is made after 26

July 31, 1987, regular interest on the amount specified in item
 (1) from the date of service to the date of payment.

3 For purposes of calculating retirement annuities under this Section, periods of service rendered after December 31, 4 5 1968 and before January 1, 1982 as a covered employee in the position of investigator for the Department of Revenue shall be 6 deemed to have been service as a noncovered employee, provided 7 8 that the employee pays to the System prior to retirement an 9 amount equal to (1) the difference between the employee 10 contributions that would have been required for such service as 11 a noncovered employee, and the amount of employee contributions 12 actually paid, plus (2) if payment is made after January 1, 13 1990, regular interest on the amount specified in item (1) from 14 the date of service to the date of payment.

15 (g) A State policeman may elect, not later than January 1, 16 1990, to establish eligible creditable service for up to 10 17 years of his service as a policeman under Article 3, by filing a written election with the Board, accompanied by payment of an 18 19 amount to be determined by the Board, equal to (i) the 20 difference between the amount of employee and employer contributions transferred to the System under Section 3-110.5, 21 22 and the amounts that would have been contributed had such 23 contributions been made at the rates applicable to State policemen, plus (ii) interest thereon at the effective rate for 24 25 each year, compounded annually, from the date of service to the 26 date of payment.

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Subject to the limitation in subsection (i), a State 1 2 policeman may elect, not later than July 1, 1993, to establish eligible creditable service for up to 10 years of his service 3 as a member of the County Police Department under Article 9, by 4 5 filing a written election with the Board, accompanied by payment of an amount to be determined by the Board, equal to 6 7 (i) the difference between the amount of employee and employer 8 contributions transferred to the System under Section 9-121.10 9 and the amounts that would have been contributed had those 10 contributions been made at the rates applicable to State policemen, plus (ii) interest thereon at the effective rate for 11 12 each year, compounded annually, from the date of service to the 13 date of payment.

(h) Subject to the limitation in subsection (i), a State 14 15 policeman or investigator for the Secretary of State may elect 16 to establish eligible creditable service for up to 12 years of 17 his service as a policeman under Article 5, by filing a written election with the Board on or before January 31, 1992, and 18 19 paying to the System by January 31, 1994 an amount to be 20 determined by the Board, equal to (i) the difference between the amount of employee and employer contributions transferred 21 22 to the System under Section 5-236, and the amounts that would 23 have been contributed had such contributions been made at the rates applicable to State policemen, plus (ii) interest thereon 24 25 at the effective rate for each year, compounded annually, from 26 the date of service to the date of payment.

Subject to the limitation in subsection (i), a State 1 2 policeman, conservation police officer, or investigator for the Secretary of State may elect to establish eligible 3 creditable service for up to 10 years of service as a sheriff's 4 5 law enforcement employee under Article 7, by filing a written election with the Board on or before January 31, 1993, and 6 7 paying to the System by January 31, 1994 an amount to be 8 determined by the Board, equal to (i) the difference between 9 the amount of employee and employer contributions transferred 10 to the System under Section 7-139.7, and the amounts that would 11 have been contributed had such contributions been made at the 12 rates applicable to State policemen, plus (ii) interest thereon 13 at the effective rate for each year, compounded annually, from the date of service to the date of payment. 14

15 Subject to the limitation in subsection (i), a State 16 policeman, conservation police officer, or investigator for 17 the Secretary of State may elect to establish eligible creditable service for up to 5 years of service as a police 18 officer under Article 3, a policeman under Article 5, a 19 20 sheriff's law enforcement employee under Article 7, a member of the county police department under Article 9, or a police 21 22 officer under Article 15 by filing a written election with the 23 Board and paying to the System an amount to be determined by the Board, equal to (i) the difference between the amount of 24 25 employee and employer contributions transferred to the System under Section 3-110.6, 5-236, 7-139.8, 9-121.10, or 15-134.4 26

and the amounts that would have been contributed had such

2 contributions been made at the rates applicable to State 3 policemen, plus (ii) interest thereon at the effective rate for 4 each year, compounded annually, from the date of service to the 5 date of payment.

6 Subject to the limitation in subsection (i), an investigator for the Office of the Attorney General, or an 7 8 investigator for the Department of Revenue, may elect to 9 establish eligible creditable service for up to 5 years of 10 service as a police officer under Article 3, a policeman under 11 Article 5, a sheriff's law enforcement employee under Article 12 7, or a member of the county police department under Article 9 by filing a written election with the Board within 6 months 13 after August 25, 2009 (the effective date of Public Act 96-745) 14 15 and paying to the System an amount to be determined by the 16 Board, equal to (i) the difference between the amount of 17 employee and employer contributions transferred to the System under Section 3-110.6, 5-236, 7-139.8, or 9-121.10 and the 18 amounts that would have been contributed had such contributions 19 20 been made at the rates applicable to State policemen, plus (ii) 21 interest thereon at the actuarially assumed rate for each year, 22 compounded annually, from the date of service to the date of 23 payment.

Subject to the limitation in subsection (i), a State policeman, conservation police officer, investigator for the Office of the Attorney General, an investigator for the

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Department of Revenue, or investigator for the Secretary of 1 2 State may elect to establish eligible creditable service for up 3 to 5 years of service as a person employed by a participating municipality to perform police duties, or law enforcement 4 5 officer employed on a full-time basis by a forest preserve district under Article 7, a county corrections officer, or a 6 7 court services officer under Article 9, by filing a written election with the Board within 6 months after August 25, 2009 8 9 (the effective date of Public Act 96-745) and paying to the 10 System an amount to be determined by the Board, equal to (i) 11 the difference between the amount of employee and employer 12 contributions transferred to the System under Sections 7-139.8 13 and 9-121.10 and the amounts that would have been contributed 14 had such contributions been made at the rates applicable to 15 State policemen, plus (ii) interest thereon at the actuarially 16 assumed rate for each year, compounded annually, from the date 17 of service to the date of payment.

(i) The total amount of eligible creditable service
established by any person under subsections (g), (h), (j), (k),
and (l) of this Section shall not exceed 12 years.

(j) Subject to the limitation in subsection (i), an investigator for the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor or a controlled substance inspector may elect to establish eligible creditable service for up to 10 years of his service as a policeman under Article 3 or a sheriff's law enforcement employee under Article 7, by filing a written

election with the Board, accompanied by payment of an amount to 1 2 be determined by the Board, equal to (1) the difference between 3 the amount of employee and employer contributions transferred to the System under Section 3-110.6 or 7-139.8, and the amounts 4 5 that would have been contributed had such contributions been made at the rates applicable to State policemen, plus (2) 6 interest thereon at the effective rate for each year, 7 8 compounded annually, from the date of service to the date of 9 payment.

10 (k) Subject to the limitation in subsection (i) of this 11 Section, an alternative formula employee may elect to establish 12 eligible creditable service for periods spent as a full-time 13 law enforcement officer or full-time corrections officer 14 employed by the federal government or by a state or local government located outside of Illinois, for which credit is not 15 16 held in any other public employee pension fund or retirement To obtain this credit, the applicant must file a 17 system. written application with the Board by March 31, 1998, 18 accompanied by evidence of eligibility acceptable to the Board 19 20 and payment of an amount to be determined by the Board, equal to (1) employee contributions for the credit being established, 21 22 based upon the applicant's salary on the first day as an 23 alternative formula employee after the employment for which credit is being established and the rates then applicable to 24 alternative formula employees, plus (2) an amount determined by 25 26 the Board to be the employer's normal cost of the benefits

1 accrued for the credit being established, plus (3) regular 2 interest on the amounts in items (1) and (2) from the first day 3 as an alternative formula employee after the employment for 4 which credit is being established to the date of payment.

5 (1) Subject to the limitation in subsection (i), a security employee of the Department of Corrections may elect, not later 6 than July 1, 1998, to establish eligible creditable service for 7 8 up to 10 years of his or her service as a policeman under 9 Article 3, by filing a written election with the Board, 10 accompanied by payment of an amount to be determined by the 11 Board, equal to (i) the difference between the amount of 12 employee and employer contributions transferred to the System 13 under Section 3-110.5, and the amounts that would have been contributed had such contributions been made at the rates 14 15 applicable to security employees of the Department of 16 Corrections, plus (ii) interest thereon at the effective rate 17 for each year, compounded annually, from the date of service to the date of payment. 18

(m) The amendatory changes to this Section made by this 19 20 amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly apply only to: (1) security employees of the Department of Juvenile Justice 21 22 employed by the Department of Corrections before the effective 23 date of this amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly and 24 transferred to the Department of Juvenile Justice by this 25 amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly; and (2) persons 26 employed by the Department of Juvenile Justice on or after the

effective date of this amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly who are required by subsection (b) of Section 3-2.5-15 of the Unified Code of Corrections to have any bachelor's or advanced degree from an accredited college or university or, in the case of persons who provide vocational training, who are required to have adequate knowledge in the skill for which they are providing the vocational training.

8 (n) A person employed in a position under subsection (b) of 9 this Section who has purchased service credit under subsection 10 (i) of Section 14-104 or subsection (b) of Section 14-105 in 11 any other capacity under this Article may convert up to 5 years 12 of that service credit into service credit covered under this 13 Section by paying to the Fund an amount equal to (1) the 14 additional employee contribution required under Section 15 14-133, plus (2) the additional employer contribution required 16 under Section 14-131, plus (3) interest on items (1) and (2) at 17 the actuarially assumed rate from the date of the service to the date of payment. 18

19 (o) Subject to the limitation in subsection (i), a 20 conservation police officer subject to subsection (g) of 21 Section 1-160 may elect to convert up to 8 years of service 22 credit established before the effective date of this amendatory 23 Act of the 101st General Assembly as a conservation police 24 officer under this Article into eligible creditable service by 25 filing a written election with the Board, accompanied by 26 payment of an amount to be determined by the Board equal to (i)

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1	the difference between the amount of the employee contributions
2	actually paid for that service and the amount of the employee
3	contributions that would have been paid had the employee
4	contributions been made as a conservation police officer under
5	this Section who is not subject to Section 1-160, plus (ii)
