## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

25 ILCS 115/1

from Ch. 63, par. 14

Amends the General Assembly Compensation Act. Provides that beginning with the first payroll of the 102nd General Assembly, the compensation to be paid per year to members of the General Assembly, including additional sums payable per year to officers of the General Assembly, shall be paid bi-monthly. Provides that members who resign before completing the entire term in office shall be compensated on a prorated basis. Provides that members completing the term of a vacancy shall be compensated on a prorated basis. Makes conforming changes.

AN ACT concerning State government.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The General Assembly Compensation Act is amended
  by changing Section 1 as follows:
- 6 (25 ILCS 115/1) (from Ch. 63, par. 14)

7 Sec. 1. Each member of the General Assembly shall receive an annual salary of \$28,000 or as set by the Compensation 8 9 Review Board, whichever is greater. The following named officers, committee chairmen and committee minority spokesmen 10 shall receive additional amounts per year for their services as 11 such officers, committee chairmen and committee minority 12 13 spokesmen respectively, as set by the Compensation Review Board 14 or, as follows, whichever is greater: Beginning the second Wednesday in January 1989, the Speaker and the minority leader 15 16 of the House of Representatives and the President and the minority leader of the Senate, \$16,000 each; the majority 17 leader in the House of Representatives \$13,500; 5 assistant 18 19 majority leaders and 5 assistant minority leaders in the 20 Senate, \$12,000 each; 6 assistant majority leaders and 6 21 assistant minority leaders in the House of Representatives, 22 \$10,500 each; 2 Deputy Majority leaders in the House of Representatives \$11,500 each; and 2 Deputy Minority leaders in 23

the House of Representatives, \$11,500 each; the majority caucus 1 2 chairman and minority caucus chairman in the Senate, \$12,000 3 each; and beginning the second Wednesday in January, 1989, the majority conference chairman and the minority conference 4 5 chairman in the House of Representatives, \$10,500 each; beginning the second Wednesday in January, 1989, the chairman 6 7 and minority spokesman of each standing committee of the 8 Senate, except the Rules Committee, the Committee on 9 Committees, and the Committee on Assignment of Bills, \$6,000 10 each; and beginning the second Wednesday in January, 1989, the 11 chairman and minority spokesman of each standing and select 12 committee of the House of Representatives, \$6,000 each; and beginning fiscal year 2020, the majority leader in the Senate, 13 14 an amount equal to the majority leader in the House. A member 15 who serves in more than one position as an officer, committee 16 chairman, or committee minority spokesman shall receive only 17 one additional amount based on the position paying the highest additional amount. The compensation provided for in this 18 19 Section to be paid per year to members of the General Assembly, including the additional sums payable per year to officers of 20 21 the General Assembly shall be paid in 12 equal monthly 22 installments until December 31, 2020. Beginning with the first 23 payroll of the 102nd General Assembly, the compensation 24 provided for in this Section to be paid per year to members of 25 the General Assembly, including additional sums payable per year to officers of the General Assembly, shall be paid 26

bi-monthly. Members who resign before completing the entire 1 2 term in office shall be compensated on a prorated basis. Members completing the term of a vacancy shall be compensated 3 on a prorated basis. The first such installment is payable on 4 5 January 31, 1977. All subsequent equal monthly installments are payable on the last working day of the month. A member who has 6 7 held office any part of a month is entitled to compensation 8 an entire month.

9 Mileage shall be paid at the rate of 20 cents per mile 10 before January 9, 1985, and at the mileage allowance rate in 11 effect under regulations promulgated pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 12 5707(b)(2) beginning January 9, 1985, for the number of actual 13 highway miles necessarily and conveniently traveled by the most feasible route to be present upon convening of the sessions of 14 15 the General Assembly by such member in each and every trip 16 during each session in going to and returning from the seat of 17 government, to be computed by the Comptroller. A member traveling by public transportation for such purposes, however, 18 shall be paid his actual cost of that transportation instead of 19 20 on the mileage rate if his cost of public transportation exceeds the amount to which he would be entitled on a mileage 21 22 basis. No member may be paid, whether on a mileage basis or for 23 actual costs of public transportation, for more than one such trip for each week the General Assembly is actually in session. 24 25 Each member shall also receive an allowance of \$36 per day for lodging and meals while in attendance at sessions of the 26

General Assembly before January 9, 1985; beginning January 9, 1 2 1985, such food and lodging allowance shall be equal to the 3 amount per day permitted to be deducted for such expenses under the Internal Revenue Code; however, beginning May 31, 1995, no 4 5 allowance for food and lodging while in attendance at sessions is authorized for periods of time after the last day in May of 6 each calendar year, except (i) if the General Assembly is 7 8 convened in special session by either the Governor or the 9 presiding officers of both houses, as provided by subsection 10 (b) of Section 5 of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution or 11 (ii) if the General Assembly is convened to consider bills 12 vetoed, item vetoed, reduced, or returned with specific recommendations for change by the Governor as provided in 13 Section 9 of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution. For 14 15 fiscal year 2011 and for session days in fiscal years 2012, 16 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019 only (i) the 17 allowance for lodging and meals is \$111 per day and (ii) mileage for automobile travel shall be reimbursed at a rate of 18 19 \$0.39 per mile.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, beginning in fiscal year 2012, travel reimbursement for General Assembly members on non-session days shall be calculated using the guidelines set forth by the Legislative Travel Control Board, except that fiscal year 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019 mileage reimbursement is set at a rate of \$0.39 per mile.

1 If a member dies having received only a portion of the 2 amount payable as compensation, the unpaid balance shall be 3 paid to the surviving spouse of such member, or, if there be 4 none, to the estate of such member.
