1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 2995 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 2995 by replacing 2 everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The Humane Care for Animals Act is amended by 4 5 changing Section 3.02 as follows: 6 (510 ILCS 70/3.02) 7 Sec. 3.02. Aggravated cruelty. (a) No person may intentionally commit an act that causes a 8 companion animal to suffer serious injury or death. Aggravated 9 10 cruelty does not include euthanasia of a companion animal 11 through recognized methods approved by the Department of 12 Agriculture unless prohibited under subsection (b). 13 (b) No individual, except a licensed veterinarian as exempted under Section 3.09, may knowingly or intentionally 14

euthanize or authorize the euthanasia of a companion animal by

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(c) A person convicted of violating this Section for an act that causes a companion animal to suffer serious injury is guilty of a Class 4 felony. A person convicted for an act that causes the death of a companion animal is quilty of a Class 3 felony Section 3.02 is quilty of a Class 4 felony. A second or subsequent violation for an act that causes a companion animal to suffer serious injury is a Class 3 felony. A second or subsequent violation for an act that causes the death of a companion animal is a Class 2 felony is a Class 3 felony. In addition to any other penalty provided by law, upon conviction for violating this Section, the court may order the convicted person to undergo a psychological or psychiatric evaluation and to undergo any treatment at the convicted person's expense that the court determines to be appropriate after due consideration of the evaluation. If the convicted person is a juvenile or a companion animal hoarder, the court must order the convicted person to undergo a psychological or psychiatric evaluation and undergo treatment that the court determines to be appropriate after due consideration of the evaluation.
