

101ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2019 and 2020 SB3068

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

30 ILCS 500/30-55 new

Amends the Illinois Procurement Code. Provides that no procurement contract for the construction, alteration, operation, repair, maintenance, or improvement of any mass transit facility, or equipment thereof, in excess of \$1,000,000 shall be awarded to or executed with any vendor that receives support from a nonmarket economy country, as defined under specified federal law. Provides that nothing in the provisions is intended to contravene any existing treaties, laws, trade agreements, or regulations of the United States or subsequent trade agreements entered into between any foreign countries and the State or the United States.

1 AN ACT concerning finance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Procurement Code is amended by adding Section 30-55 as follows:
- 6 (30 ILCS 500/30-55 new)
- Sec. 30-55. Construction contracts involving nonmarket economy countries.
- 9 (a) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no procurement contract for the construction, alteration, 10 operation, repair, maintenance, or improvement of any mass 11 12 transit facility, or equipment thereof, in excess of \$1,000,000 shall be awarded to or executed with any vendor that receives 13 14 support from a nonmarket economy country as defined in section 7781(18) of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1677 (18)) and 15 16 was identified by the United States Trade Representative in the most recent report required by section 182 of the Trade Act of 17 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2242) as a priority foreign country, and is 18 19 subject to monitoring by the United States Trade Representative 20 under section 306 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2416).
 - (b) Nothing in this Section is intended to contravene any existing treaties, laws, trade agreements, or regulations of the United States or subsequent trade agreements entered into

- between any foreign countries and the State or the United
