Amends the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act. Creates a uniform statement of economic interest form that must be completed by all persons who are required to file that form under the Act. Changes the nature of the required disclosures that must be made. Requires the Secretary of State to adjust specified amounts that prompt disclosure under the Act for purposes of inflation, and requires the Secretary to make conforming changes to the statement of economic interest form. Requires candidates filing for Supreme Court Judge, appellate court judge, circuit court judge, or judicial retention to file his or her statement of economic interests in written or printed form. Repeals a provision that established a separate form for persons required to file a statement of economic interests with county clerks. Defines terms. Adds applicability clause. Makes conforming changes.

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1 AN ACT concerning ethics.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Governmental Ethics Act is amended
by changing Sections 1-110, 4A-102, 4A-103, and 4A-108 and by
adding Sections 1-102.5, 1-104.3, 1-104.4, 1-104.5, 1-105.2,
1-105.3, 1-105.5, 1-105.6, 1-105.7, 1-112.5, 1-113.6, and
1-113.7 as follows:

9 (5 ILCS 420/1-102.5 new)

Sec. 1-102.5. Asset. "Asset" means, for the purposes of 10 Sections 4A-102 and 4A-103, an item that is owned and has 11 12 monetary value. For the purposes of Sections 4A-102 and 4A-103, assets include, but are not limited to: stocks, bonds, sector 13 14 mutual funds, sector exchange traded funds, commodity futures, investment real estate, and partnership interests. For the 15 16 purposes of Sections 4A-102 and 4A-103, assets do not include: personal residences; personal vehicles; savings or checking 17 accounts; bonds, notes, or securities issued by any branch of 18 19 federal, state, or local government; Medicare benefits; inheritances or bequests; diversified funds; annuities; 20 21 pensions (including government pensions); retirement accounts; 22 college savings plans that are qualified tuition plans; qualified tax-advantaged savings programs that allow 23

1 <u>individuals to save for disability-related expenses; or</u> 2 <u>tangible personal property.</u>

3 (5 ILCS 420/1-104.3 new) 4 Sec. 1-104.3. Creditor. "Creditor" means, for the purposes 5 of Sections 4A-102 and 4A-103, an individual, organization, or 6 other business entity to whom money or its equivalent is owed, no matter whether that obligation is secured or unsecured, 7 8 except that if a filer makes a loan to members of his or her 9 family, or a political committee registered with the Illinois 10 State Board of Election, or a political committee, principal 11 campaign committee, or authorized committee registered with 12 the Federal Election Commission, then that filer does not, by 13 making such a loan, become a creditor of that individual or entity for the purposes of Sections 4A-102 and 4A-103 of this 14 15 Act.

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from friends or business associates, business loans made 1 2 outside the lender's regular course of business, and loans made 3 at below market rates. For the purposes of Sections 4A-102 and 4 4A-103, "debt" does not include: (i) debts to or from financial 5 institutions or government entities, such as mortgages, student loans, credit card debts, or loans secured by 6 7 automobiles, household furniture, or appliances, as long as 8 those loans were made on terms available to the general public 9 and do not exceed the purchase price of the items securing 10 them; or (ii) debts to or from a political committee registered 11 with the Illinois State Board of Elections or political 12 committees, principal campaign committees, or authorized committees registered with the Federal Election Commission. 13

22	relationship" means, for the purposes of Sections 4A-102 and
23	4A-103, any joint or shared ownership interests in businesses

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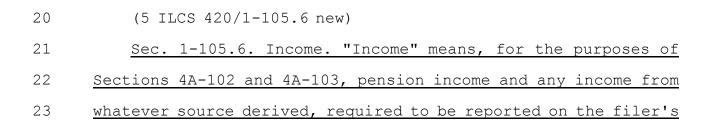
1	than commercial lending institutions, where: (a) the filer is
2	entitled to receive (i) more than 7.5% of the total
3	distributable income, or (ii) an amount in excess of the salary
4	of the Governor; or (b) the filer together with his or her
5	spouse or minor children is entitled to receive (i) more than
6	15%, in the aggregate, of the total distributable income, or
7	(ii) an amount in excess of 2 times the salary of the Governor.

9 Sec. 1-105.3. Family. "Family" means, for the purposes of 10 Sections 4A-102 and 4A-103, a filer's spouse, children, 11 step-children, parents, step-parents, siblings, step-siblings, 12 half-siblings, sons-in-law, daughters-in-law, grandfathers, 13 grandmothers, grandsons, and granddaughters, as well as the 14 father, mother, grandfather, and grandmother of the filer's 15 spouse, and any person living with the filer.

Sec. 1-105.5. Filer. "Filer" means, for the purposes of
 Section 4A-102 and 4A-103, a person required to file a
 statement of economic interests pursuant to this Act.

Campaign receipts shall not be</u> 5 <u>included in this statement. The following interests shall be</u> 6 listed by all persons required to file:

7 (1) each asset that has a value of more than \$5,000 as 8 of the end of the preceding calendar year and is: (i) held 9 in the filer's name, (ii) held jointly by the filer with 10 his or her spouse, or (iii) held jointly by the filer with 11 his or her minor child or children;

12 (2) excluding the income from the position that requires the filing of a statement of economic interests 13 14 under this Act, each source of income in excess of \$1,200 15 during the preceding calendar year (as required to be 16 reported on the filer's federal income tax return covering the preceding calendar year) and, if the sale or transfer 17 of an asset produced more than \$5,000 in capital gains 18 19 during the preceding calendar year, the transaction date on 20 which that asset was sold or transferred;

21 <u>(3) each creditor of a debt in excess of \$5,000 that,</u> 22 <u>during the preceding calendar year, was: (i) owed by the</u> 23 <u>filer, (ii) owed jointly by the filer with his or her</u> 24 <u>spouse or (iii) owed jointly by the filer with his or her</u> 25 <u>minor child or children;</u>

(4) each debtor of a debt in excess of \$5,000 that,

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1	during the preceding calendar year, was: (i) owed to the
2	filer, (ii) owed jointly to the filer with his or her
3	spouse, or (iii) owed jointly to the filer with his or her
4	minor child or children;
5	(5) the name of each unit of government of which the
6	filer was an employee, contractor, or office holder during

17	honorarium or honoraria, valued singly or in the aggregate
18	in excess of \$500 that was received during the preceding
19	calendar year, excluding any gift or gifts from a member of
20	the filer's family that was not known to the filer to be
21	registered as a lobbyist with any unit of government in the
22	State of Illinois.
23	For the purposes of this Section, the unit of local
24	government in relation to which a person is required to file
25	under item (e) of Section 4A-101.5 shall be the unit of local
26	government that contributes to the pension fund of which such

1 person is a member of the board.

(b) Beginning December 1, 2025, and for every 5 years 2 thereafter, the Secretary of State shall adjust the amounts 3 specified under this Section that prompt disclosure under this 4 5 Act for purposes of inflation as determined by the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers as issued by the United 6 7 States Department of Labor and rounded to the nearest \$100. The Secretary shall publish this information on the official 8 9 website of the Secretary of State, and make changes to the statement of economic interest form to be completed for the 10 11 following year.

12 The interest (if constructively controlled by the person making 13 the statement) of a spouse or any other party, shall be 14 considered to be the same as the interest of the person making 15 the statement. Campaign receipts shall not be included in this 16 statement.

17 (a) The following interests shall be listed by all 18 persons required to file:

19 (1) The name, address and type of practice of any 20 professional organization or individual professional 21 practice in which the person making the statement was 22 -officer, director, associate, partner an - or 23 proprietor, or served in any advisory capacity, from which income in excess of \$1200 was derived during the 24 25 preceding calendar year;

26 (2) The nature of professional services (other

than services rendered to the unit or units of 1 2 government in relation to which the person is required to file) and the nature of the entity to which they 3 were rendered if fees exceeding \$5,000 were received 4 5 during the preceding calendar year from the entity for professional services rendered by the person making 6 7 the statement. (3) The identity (including the address or legal 8 description of real estate) of any capital asset from 9 10 which a capital gain of \$5,000 or more was realized in 11 the preceding calendar year. 12 (4) The name of any unit of government which has employed the person making the statement during the 13 preceding calendar year other than the unit or units of 14 15 government in relation to which the person is required 16 to file. 17 (5) The name of any entity from which a gift or gifts, or honorarium or honoraria, valued singly or in 18 the aggregate in excess of \$500, was received during 19 20 the preceding calendar year. (b) The following interests shall also be listed by 21 22 persons listed in items (a) through (f), item (l), item

23 (n), and item (p) of Section 4A-101:

24 (1) The name and instrument of ownership in any
 25 entity doing business in the State of Illinois, in
 26 which an ownership interest held by the person at the

1date of filing is in excess of \$5,000 fair market value2or from which dividends of in excess of \$1,200 were3derived during the preceding calendar year. (In the4case of real estate, location thereof shall be listed5by street address, or if none, then by legal6description). No time or demand deposit in a financial7institution, nor any debt instrument need be listed;

8 (2) Except for professional service entities, the 9 name of any entity and any position held therein from 10 which income of in excess of \$1,200 was derived during 11 the preceding calendar year, if the entity does 12 business in the State of Illinois. No time or demand 13 deposit in a financial institution, nor any debt 14 instrument need be listed.

15 (3) The identity of any compensated lobbyist with 16 whom the person making the statement maintains a close 17 economic association, including the name of the lobbyist and specifying the legislative matter or 18 19 matters which are the object of the lobbying activity, 20 and describing the general type of economic activity of 21 the client or principal on whose behalf that person is 22 lobbying.

23 (c) The following interests shall also be listed by 24 persons listed in items (a) through (c) and item (c) of 25 Section 4A-101.5:

(1) The name and instrument of ownership in any

entity doing business with a unit of local government 1 2 in relation to which the person is required to file if 3 the ownership interest of the person filing is greater than \$5,000 fair market value as of the date of filing 4 or if dividends in excess of \$1,200 were received from 5 the entity during the preceding calendar year. (In the 6 case of real estate, location thereof shall be listed 7 by street address, or if none, then by legal 8 description). No time or demand deposit in a financial 9 10 institution, nor any debt instrument need be listed.

11 (2) Except for professional service entities, the 12 name of any entity and any position held therein from which income in excess of \$1,200 was derived during the 13 preceding calendar year if the entity does business 14 with a unit of local government in relation to which 15 16 the person is required to file. No time or demand 17 deposit in a financial institution, nor any debt instrument need be listed. 18

19 (3) The name of any entity and the nature of the 20 governmental action requested by any entity which has 21 applied to a unit of local government in relation to 22 which the person must file for any license, franchise 23 or permit for annexation, zoning or rezoning of real estate during the preceding calendar year if the 24 ownership interest of the person filing is in excess of 25 26 \$5,000 fair market value at the time of filing or if 1 income or dividends in excess of \$1,200 were received 2 by the person filing from the entity during the 3 preceding calendar year.

For the purposes of this Section, the unit of local government in relation to which a person required to file under item (e) of Section 4A 101.5 shall be the unit of local government that contributes to the pension fund of which such person is a member of the board.

25 Sec. 4A-108. Internet-based systems of filing.

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(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act or any 1 2 other law, the Secretary of State and county clerks are 3 authorized to institute an Internet-based system for the filing of statements of economic interests in their offices. With 4 5 respect to county clerk systems, the determination to institute such a system shall be in the sole discretion of the county 6 7 clerk and shall meet the requirements set out in this Section. 8 With respect to a Secretary of State system, the determination 9 to institute such a system shall be in the sole discretion of 10 the Secretary of State and shall meet the requirements set out 11 in this Section and those Sections of the State Officials and 12 Employees Ethics Act requiring ethics officer review prior to 13 filing. The system shall be capable of allowing an ethics officer to approve a statement of economic interests and shall 14 include a means to amend a statement of economic interests. 15 16 When this Section does not modify or remove the requirements 17 set forth elsewhere in this Article, those requirements shall apply to any system of Internet-based filing authorized by this 18 Section does modify or remove When this 19 Section. the requirements set forth elsewhere in this Article, 20 the provisions of this Section shall apply to any system of 21 22 Internet-based filing authorized by this Section.

(b) In any system of Internet-based filing of statements of economic interests instituted by the Secretary of State or a county clerk:

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(1) Any filing of an Internet-based statement of

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economic interests shall be the equivalent of the filing of a verified, written statement of economic interests as required by Section 4A-101 or 4A-101.5 and the equivalent of the filing of a verified, dated, and signed statement of economic interests as required by Section <u>4A-103</u> 4A 104.

The Secretary of State and county clerks who 6 (2)7 institute a system of Internet-based filing of statements of economic interests shall establish a password-protected 8 9 website to receive the filings of such statements. A 10 website established under this Section shall set forth and 11 provide a means of responding to the items set forth in 12 Section 4A-103 $\frac{4A-102}{4A-102}$ that are required of a person who files a statement of economic interests with that officer. 13 A website established under this Section shall set forth 14 15 and provide a means of generating a printable receipt page 16 acknowledging filing.

17 (3) The times for the filing of statements of economic interests set forth in Section 4A-105 shall be followed in 18 19 any system of Internet-based filing of statements of 20 economic interests; provided that a candidate for elective office who is required to file a statement of economic 21 22 interests in relation to his or her candidacy pursuant to 23 Section 4A-105(a) shall receive a written or printed 24 receipt for his or her filing.

A candidate filing for Governor, Lieutenant Governor,
 Attorney General, Secretary of State, Treasurer,

1 Comptroller, Senate, State House State or of 2 Representatives, Supreme Court Judge, appellate court 3 judge, circuit court judge, or judicial retention shall not use the Internet to file his or her statement of economic 4 5 interests, but shall file his or her statement of economic 6 interests in a written or printed form and shall receive a 7 written or printed receipt for his or her filing. Annually, 8 the duly appointed ethics officer for each legislative 9 caucus shall certify to the Secretary of State whether his 10 or her caucus members will file their statements of 11 economic interests electronically or in a written or 12 printed format for that year. If the ethics officer for a caucus certifies that the statements of economic interests 13 14 shall be written or printed, then members of the General 15 Assembly of that caucus shall not use the Internet to file 16 his or her statement of economic interests, but shall file his or her statement of economic interests in a written or 17 printed form and shall receive a written or printed receipt 18 19 for his or her filing. If no certification is made by an 20 ethics officer for a legislative caucus, or if a member of 21 the General Assembly is not affiliated with a legislative 22 caucus, then the affected member or members of the General 23 Assembly may file their statements of economic interests 24 using the Internet.

25 (4) In the first year of the implementation of a system
26 of Internet-based filing of statements of economic

interests, each person required to file such a statement is to be notified in writing of his or her obligation to file his or her statement of economic interests by way of the Internet-based system. If access to the <u>website</u> web site requires a code or password, this information shall be included in the notice prescribed by this paragraph.

7 (5) When a person required to file a statement of economic interests has supplied the Secretary of State or a 8 9 county clerk, as applicable, with an email address for the 10 purpose of receiving notices under this Article by email, a 11 notice sent by email to the supplied email address shall be 12 the equivalent of a notice sent by first class mail, as set forth in Section 4A-106 or 4A-106.5. A person who has 13 14 supplied such an email address shall notify the Secretary 15 of State or county clerk, as applicable, when his or her 16 email address changes or if he or she no longer wishes to 17 receive notices by email.

(6) If any person who is required to file a statement 18 19 of economic interests and who has chosen to receive notices 20 by email fails to file his or her statement by May 10, then 21 the Secretary of State or county clerk, as applicable, 22 shall send an additional email notice on that date, 23 informing the person that he or she has not filed and 24 describing the penalties for late filing and failing to 25 file. This notice shall be in addition to other notices 26 provided for in this Article.

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(7) The Secretary of State and each county clerk who 1 2 institutes a system of Internet-based filing of statements 3 of economic interests may also institute an Internet-based process for the filing of the list of names and addresses 4 5 persons required to file statements of economic of 6 interests by the chief administrative officers that must 7 file such information with the Secretary of State or county 8 clerk, as applicable, pursuant to Section 4A-106 or 9 4A-106.5. Whenever the Secretary of State or a county clerk 10 institutes such a system under this paragraph, every chief 11 administrative officer must use the system to file this 12 information.

13 (8) The Secretary of State and any county clerk who 14 institutes a system of Internet-based filing of statements 15 of economic interests shall post the contents of such 16 statements filed with him or her available for inspection 17 and copying on a publicly accessible website. Such postings 18 shall not include the addresses or signatures of the 19 filers.
