

101ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2019 and 2020 SB4028

Introduced 1/4/2021, by Sen. Chapin Rose

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 100/5-45.8 new 20 ILCS 605/605-1055 new

Amends the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Establishes the COVID-19 Small Business Relief Program for specified purposes. Provides that from appropriations for the COVID-19 Small Business Relief Program from the State Coronavirus Urgent Remediation Emergency Fund, the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity shall provide financial assistance through grants, expense reimbursements, or subsidies to qualifying businesses or a qualified partner to cover expenses or losses incurred due to business interruptions caused by their forced closure or inability to carry out regular functions in an economically viable manner under Tier 3 of the Governor's Restoring Illinois plan. Provides for the adoption of rules. Provides for powers of the Department concerning the Program. Amends the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act to provide for the adoption of emergency rules. Defines terms. Effective immediately.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY

1 AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Administrative Procedure Act is amended by adding Section 5-45.8 as follows:
- 6 (5 ILCS 100/5-45.8 new)
- 7 Sec. 5-45.8. Emergency rulemaking; COVID-19 Small Business Relief Program. To provide for the expeditious and timely 8 9 implementation of the COVID-19 Small Business Relief Program created under Section 605-1055 of the Department of Commerce 10 and Economic Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code 11 12 of Illinois, emergency rules implementing the COVID-19 Small Business Relief Program may be adopted in accordance with 13 14 Section 5-45 by the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity. The adoption of emergency rules authorized by 15 16 Section 5-45 and this Section is deemed to be necessary for the 17 public interest, safety, and welfare.
- Section 10. The Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by adding Section 605-1055 as follows:

This Section is repealed on January 1, 2026.

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(20 ILCS 605/605-1055 new) 1

2 Sec. 605-1055. COVID-19 Small Business Relief Program.

(a) Purpose. The Department may receive, directly or indirectly, federal funds under the authority of legislation passed in response to the Coronavirus epidemic including, but not limited to, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, P.L. 116-136 (the CARES Act). Section 5001 of the <u>CARES Act establishes</u> the Coronavirus Relief Fund, which authorized the State to expend funds that are necessary to respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency. The financial support of qualifying businesses is a necessary expense under federal guidance for implementing Section 5001 of the CARES Act. Upon receipt or availability of such funds, and subject to appropriations for their use, the Department shall administer a program to provide financial assistance to qualifying businesses that have experienced interruption of business due to their forced closure or inability to carry out regular functions in an economically viable manner under Tier 3 of the Governor's Restoring Illinois plan. Support may be provided directly by the Department to qualifying businesses or in cooperation with a qualified partner. Financial assistance may include, but not be limited to grants, expense reimbursements, or subsidies. (b) From appropriations for the COVID-19 Small Business

Relief Program from the State Coronavirus Urgent Remediation

Emergency Fund, the Department shall provide financial

assistance through grants, expense reimbursements, or subsidies to qualifying businesses or a qualified partner to cover expenses or losses incurred due to business interruptions caused by their forced closure or inability to carry out regular functions in an economically viable manner under Tier 3 of the Governor's Restoring Illinois plan. All spending related to this program must be reimbursable by the Federal Coronavirus Relief Fund in accordance with Section 5001 of the federal CARES Act and any related federal guidance, or the provisions of any other federal source supporting the program.

(c) The Department may establish by rule administrative procedures for the grant Program, including any application procedures, grant agreements, certifications, payment methodologies, and other accountability measures that may be imposed upon participants in the Program. The emergency rulemaking process may be used to adopt the initial rules of the grant Program.

(d) The Department has the power to:

(1) provide grants, subsidies, and expense reimbursements to qualified businesses or, on behalf of qualified businesses, to qualified partners from appropriations to cover qualified businesses eligible costs or losses incurred due to their forced closure or inability to carry out regular functions in an economically viable manner under Tier 3 of the Governor's Restoring Illinois plan.

14	related support.
15	(e) Definitions. As used in the Section:
16	"Qualified partner" means a financial institution or
17	nonprofit organization with which the Department has entered
18	into an agreement or contract to provide or incentivize
19	assistance to qualifying businesses.
20	"Qualifying businesses" means a business that is
21	experiencing business interruption due to its forced closure or
22	inability to carry out regular functions in an economically
23	viable manner under Tier 3 of the Governor's Restoring Illinois
24	plan and is eligible for reimbursement as prescribed by Section
25	601 (a) of the Social Security Act and added by Section 5001 of

the CARES Act or other federal legislation addressing the
