SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

110 ILCS 947/35

Amends the Higher Education Student Assistance Act. Provides that an applicant enrolled in a certificate program offered by a public community college is eligible for a Monetary Award Program grant until he or she completes the certificate program. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Higher Education Student Assistance Act is
5 amended by changing Section 35 as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 947/35)

7 Sec. 35. Monetary award program.

8 (a) The Commission shall, each year, receive and consider
9 applications for grant assistance under this Section. Subject
10 to a separate appropriation for such purposes, an applicant is
11 eligible for a grant under this Section when the Commission
12 finds that the applicant:

13 (1) is a resident of this State and a citizen or
14 permanent resident of the United States; and

15 (2) in the absence of grant assistance, will be
16 deterred by financial considerations from completing an
17 educational program at the qualified institution of his or
18 her choice, including any certificate program offered by a
19 public community college.

20 (b) The Commission shall award renewals only upon the
21 student's application and upon the Commission's finding that
22 the applicant:

23 (1) has remained a student in good standing;

1 (2) remains a resident of this State; and

2 (3) is in a financial situation that continues to
3 warrant assistance.

4 (c) All grants shall be applicable only to tuition and
5 necessary fee costs. The Commission shall determine the grant
6 amount for each student, which shall not exceed the smallest
7 of the following amounts:

8 (1) subject to appropriation, \$5,468 for fiscal year
9 2009, \$5,968 for fiscal year 2010, and \$6,468 for fiscal
10 year 2011 and each fiscal year thereafter, or such lesser
11 amount as the Commission finds to be available, during an
12 academic year;

13 (2) the amount which equals 2 semesters or 3 quarters
14 tuition and other necessary fees required generally by the
15 institution of all full-time undergraduate students; or

16 (3) such amount as the Commission finds to be
17 appropriate in view of the applicant's financial
18 resources.

19 Subject to appropriation, the maximum grant amount for
20 students not subject to subdivision (1) of this subsection (c)
21 must be increased by the same percentage as any increase made
22 by law to the maximum grant amount under subdivision (1) of
23 this subsection (c).

24 "Tuition and other necessary fees" as used in this Section
25 include the customary charge for instruction and use of
26 facilities in general, and the additional fixed fees charged

1 for specified purposes, which are required generally of
2 nongrant recipients for each academic period for which the
3 grant applicant actually enrolls, but do not include fees
4 payable only once or breakage fees and other contingent
5 deposits which are refundable in whole or in part. The
6 Commission may prescribe, by rule not inconsistent with this
7 Section, detailed provisions concerning the computation of
8 tuition and other necessary fees.

9 (d) No applicant, including those presently receiving
10 scholarship assistance under this Act, is eligible for
11 monetary award program consideration under this Act after
12 receiving a baccalaureate degree or the equivalent of 135
13 semester credit hours of award payments. However, an applicant
14 enrolled in a certificate program offered by a public
15 community college may continue to be eligible for monetary
16 award program consideration under this Act until the
17 completion of the certificate program even if he or she has
18 exceeded this limitation.

19 (d-5) In this subsection (d-5), "renewing applicant" means
20 a student attending an institution of higher learning who
21 received a Monetary Award Program grant during the prior
22 academic year. Beginning with the processing of applications
23 for the 2020-2021 academic year, the Commission shall annually
24 publish a priority deadline date for renewing applicants.
25 Subject to appropriation, a renewing applicant who files by
26 the published priority deadline date shall receive a grant if

1 he or she continues to meet the eligibility requirements under
2 this Section. A renewing applicant's failure to apply by the
3 priority deadline date established under this subsection (d-5)
4 shall not disqualify him or her from receiving a grant if
5 sufficient funding is available to provide awards after that
6 date.

7 (e) The Commission, in determining the number of grants to
8 be offered, shall take into consideration past experience with
9 the rate of grant funds unclaimed by recipients. The
10 Commission shall notify applicants that grant assistance is
11 contingent upon the availability of appropriated funds.

12 (e-5) The General Assembly finds and declares that it is
13 an important purpose of the Monetary Award Program to
14 facilitate access to college both for students who pursue
15 postsecondary education immediately following high school and
16 for those who pursue postsecondary education later in life,
17 particularly Illinoisans who are dislocated workers with
18 financial need and who are seeking to improve their economic
19 position through education. For the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017
20 academic years, the Commission shall give additional and
21 specific consideration to the needs of dislocated workers with
22 the intent of allowing applicants who are dislocated workers
23 an opportunity to secure financial assistance even if applying
24 later than the general pool of applicants. The Commission's
25 consideration shall include, in determining the number of
26 grants to be offered, an estimate of the resources needed to

1 serve dislocated workers who apply after the Commission
2 initially suspends award announcements for the upcoming
3 regular academic year, but prior to the beginning of that
4 academic year. For the purposes of this subsection (e-5), a
5 dislocated worker is defined as in the federal Workforce
6 Innovation and Opportunity Act.

7 (f) (Blank).

8 (g) The Commission shall determine the eligibility of and
9 make grants to applicants enrolled at qualified for-profit
10 institutions in accordance with the criteria set forth in this
11 Section. The eligibility of applicants enrolled at such
12 for-profit institutions shall be limited as follows:

13 (1) Beginning with the academic year 1997, only to
14 eligible first-time freshmen and first-time transfer
15 students who have attained an associate degree.

16 (2) Beginning with the academic year 1998, only to
17 eligible freshmen students, transfer students who have
18 attained an associate degree, and students who receive a
19 grant under paragraph (1) for the academic year 1997 and
20 whose grants are being renewed for the academic year 1998.

21 (3) Beginning with the academic year 1999, to all
22 eligible students.

23 (h) The Commission may adopt rules to implement this
24 Section.
