SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/5-1a

from Ch. 122, par. 5-1a

Amends the Trustees of Schools Article of the School Code. Allows the school board of a high school district located in a Class II county school unit to withdraw from the jurisdiction and authority of the trustees of schools and the township treasurer of a township in which all or any part of the school district is located if the school boards of the underlying elementary school districts whose territory includes all or any part of the territory included within that high school district and whose student population represents at least 50% of the total student population of that high school district consent to the proposed withdrawal. Provides that if consent is received and a resolution is adopted and passed, the school board of the withdrawing school district must elect or appoint its own school treasurer. Thereafter, provides that the trustees of schools shall no longer have or exercise any powers and duties with respect to the school district or the school district's business, operations, or assets; requires the township trustees to transfer and deliver to the school board all books and records relating to the school district's business and affairs; and provides that legal title to school buildings and school sites located within the school district shall be deemed transferred by operation of law to and shall vest in the school board. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
5 5-1a as follows:

7 Sec. 5-1a. High school districts.

(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article or 8 9 the School Code, the school board of any high school district that is located in a Class II county school unit and that on or 10 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 1991 is 11 subject to the jurisdiction and authority of a township 12 treasurer and trustees of schools of a township in which all or 13 14 any part of that school district is located may not withdraw from the jurisdiction and authority of that township treasurer 15 16 and those trustees of schools and transfer or otherwise submit 17 to the jurisdiction and authority of a township treasurer or trustees of school of another township, unless the school 18 boards of the board of each underlying elementary school 19 20 districts district whose territory includes all or any part of the territory included within that high school district and 21 22 whose student population represents at least 50% of the total student population of that high school district, 23 by

resolution, consent consents to the proposed withdrawal by the 1 2 school board of that high school district from the jurisdiction and authority of the township treasurer 3 and 4 trustees of schools of the township to which that high school 5 district is subject and the transfer or other submission by the school board of that high school district 6 7 jurisdiction and authority of a township treasurer 8 of schools of another township.

9 Upon withdrawal under this Section by proper resolution, 10 the school board of the withdrawing school district shall, 11 upon the adoption and passage of a resolution, elect or 12 appoint its own school treasurer as provided in Section 8-1. 13 Upon the adoption and passage of a resolution and the election 14 or appointment by the school board of its own school treasurer: (1) the trustees of schools shall no longer have or 15 16 exercise any powers and duties with respect to the school 17 district governed by the school board or with respect to the school business, operations, or assets of the school district; 18 19 and (2) all books and records of the township trustees 20 relating to the school business and affairs of the school district shall be transferred and delivered to the school 21 22 board of the school district. Upon withdrawal, the legal title to and all right, title, and interest formerly held by the 23 township trustees in any school buildings and school sites 24 25 used and occupied by the school board of the withdrawing school district for school purposes, that legal title, right, 26

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1 title, and interest thereafter having been transferred to and 2 vested in the regional board of school trustees under Public 3 Act 87-473 until the abolition of that regional board of 4 school trustees by Public Act 87-969, shall be deemed 5 transferred by operation of law to and shall vest in the school 6 board of that school district.

(b) A high school district that is subject to 7 the jurisdiction and authority of the township treasurer 8 and 9 trustees of schools of a township in which those offices are 10 abolished as provided in subsection (c) of Section 5-1 shall 11 thereupon be required to appoint its own school treasurer as 12 provided in paragraph (4) of subsection (c) of Section 5-1 and 13 subsection (c) of Section 8-1, and shall be subject to and governed by the other changes made to the School Code by this 14 amendatory Act of 1991, insofar as the same are applicable to a 15 16 high school district.
