2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Department of Commerce and Economic
Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois
is amended by adding Section 605-1060 as follows:

8 Sec. 605-1060. Illinois Innovation Voucher Program.

9 (a) The Department is authorized to establish the Illinois Innovation Voucher Program to be administered in accordance 10 with this Section for the purpose of fostering research and 11 12 development in key industry clusters leading to the creation of new products and services that can be marketed by Illinois 13 14 businesses. The Department may award innovation vouchers to eligible businesses to offset a portion of expenses incurred 15 16 through a collaborative research engagement with an Illinois 17 institution of higher education.

18 (b) The Department may award matching funds in the form of 19 innovation vouchers up to 75% of the cost of the research 20 engagement not to exceed \$75,000. A business may receive only 21 one innovation voucher under this Section per year.

22 (c) The Department when administering the Program under 23 <u>this Section:</u>
