1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
- 5 14-17 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/14-17 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 14-17. COVID-19 recovery post-secondary transition</u>
- 8 recovery eligibility.
- 9 (a) If a student with an individualized education program
- 10 (IEP) reaches the age of 22 during the time in which the
- 11 <u>student's in-person instruction, services, or activities are</u>
- suspended for a period of 3 months or more during the school
- 13 year as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the student is
- 14 eligible for such services up to the end of the regular
- 15 <u>2021-2022 school year.</u>
- 16 (b) This Section does not apply to any student who is no
- 17 longer a resident of the school district that was responsible
- 18 for the student's IEP at the time the student reached the
- 19 <u>student's 22nd birthday.</u>
- 20 (c) The IEP goals in effect when the student reached the
- 21 <u>student's 22nd birthday shall be resumed unless there is an</u>
- 22 agreement that the goals should be revised to appropriately
- 23 <u>meet the student's current transition needs.</u>

- 1 (d) If a student was in a private therapeutic day or
- 2 <u>residential program when the student reached the student's</u>
- 3 <u>22nd birthday</u>, the school district is not required to resume
- 4 that program for the student if the student has aged out of the
- 5 program or the funding for supporting the student's placement
- 6 <u>in the facility is no longer available.</u>
- 7 (e) Within 30 days after the effective date of this
- 8 amendatory Act of the 102nd General Assembly, each school
- 9 <u>district shall provide notification of the availability of</u>
- 10 services under this Section to each student covered by this
- 11 Section by regular mail sent to the last known address of the
- 12 student or the student's parent or guardian.
- 13 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 14 becoming law.
