

102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2021 and 2022 HB3921

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 2610/50 new 55 ILCS 5/3-6041 new 65 ILCS 5/11-1-15 new

Amends the State Police Act, the Counties Code, and the Illinois Municipal Code. Provides that an Illinois State Police officer, county sheriff, or municipal police officer may use a patrol vehicle to transport a sick or injured person if an ambulance or specialized emergency medical service vehicle is not available or on-scene, or a medical emergency exists. Exempts the Illinois State Police, county, or municipality and an Illinois State Police officer, county sheriff, or municipal police officer from liability for an act or omission in providing medical emergency transportation, unless the act or omission constitutes willful or wanton misconduct.

1 AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 1. This Act may be referred to as Courtney's Law.
- 5 Section 5. The State Police Act is amended by adding

- 11 transport a sick or injured person if an ambulance or
- 12 specialized emergency medical service vehicle is not available
- or on-scene, or a medical emergency exists.
- 14 (b) If a municipal police officer transports a sick or
- injured person under this Section, neither the municipality
- 16 nor a municipal police officer shall be liable as a result of
- 17 the municipal police officer's act or omission in providing
- 18 medical emergency transportation, including any assistance
- 19 related thereto, unless the act or omission constitutes
- 20 willful and wanton misconduct.
- 21 (c) As used in this Section:
- 22 "Ambulance" has the meaning defined in Section 3.85 of the
- 23 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems Act.
