2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 4688 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section 21B-45 as follows:
6	(105 ILCS 5/21B-45)
7	Sec. 21B-45. Professional Educator License renewal.
8	(a) Individuals holding a Professional Educator License
9	are required to complete the licensure renewal requirements as
10	specified in this Section, unless otherwise provided in this
11	Code.
12	Individuals holding a Professional Educator License shall
13	meet the renewal requirements set forth in this Section,
14	unless otherwise provided in this Code. If an individual holds
15	a license endorsed in more than one area that has different
16	renewal requirements, that individual shall follow the renewal

1 requirements for the position for which he or she spends the 2 majority of his or her time working.

(b) All Professional Educator Licenses not renewed as 3 provided in this Section shall lapse on September 1 of that 4 5 year. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Section, if a license holder's electronic mail address is available, the 6 State Board of Education shall send him or her notification 7 8 electronically that his or her license will lapse if not renewed, to be sent no more than 6 months prior to the license 9 10 lapsing. Lapsed licenses may be immediately reinstated upon 11 (i) payment by the applicant of a \$500 penalty to the State Board of Education or (ii) the demonstration of proficiency by 12 13 completing 9 semester hours of coursework from a regionally 14 accredited institution of higher education in the content area 15 that most aligns with one or more of the educator's 16 endorsement areas. Any and all back fees, including without limitation registration fees owed from the time of expiration 17 of the license until the date of reinstatement, shall be paid 18 and kept in accordance with the provisions in Article 3 of this 19 20 Code concerning an institute fund and the provisions in 21 Article 21B of this Code concerning fees and requirements for 22 registration. Licenses not registered in accordance with 23 Section 21B-40 of this Code shall lapse after a period of 6 24 months from the expiration of the last year of registration or 25 on January 1 of the fiscal year following initial issuance of 26 license. An unregistered license is invalid after the

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1 September 1 for employment and performance of services in an Illinois public or State-operated school or cooperative and in 2 3 a charter school. Any license or endorsement mav be 4 voluntarily surrendered by the license holder. A voluntarily 5 surrendered license shall be treated as a revoked license. An with Stipulations 6 Educator License with onlv а 7 paraprofessional endorsement does not lapse.

(c) From July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014, in order to 8 9 satisfy the requirements for licensure renewal provided for in 10 this Section, each professional educator licensee with an 11 administrative endorsement who is working in a position requiring such endorsement shall 12 complete one Illinois Administrators' Academy course, as described in Article 2 of 13 14 this Code, per fiscal year.

15 (c-5) All licenses issued by the State Board of Education 16 under this Article that expire on June 30, 2020 and have not 17 been renewed by the end of the 2020 renewal period shall be 18 extended for one year and shall expire on June 30, 2021.

(d) Beginning July 1, 2014, in order to satisfy the 19 requirements for licensure renewal provided for in this 20 Section, each professional educator licensee may create a 21 22 professional development plan each year. The plan shall 23 address one or more of the endorsements that are required of 24 his or her educator position if the licensee is employed and 25 performing services in an Illinois public or State-operated 26 school or cooperative. If the licensee is employed in a

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1 charter school, the plan shall address that endorsement or 2 those endorsements most closely related to his or her educator 3 position. Licensees employed and performing services in any 4 other Illinois schools may participate in the renewal 5 requirements by adhering to the same process.

6 Except as otherwise provided in this Section, the 7 licensee's professional development activities shall align 8 with one or more of the following criteria:

9 (1) activities are of a type that engage participants 10 over a sustained period of time allowing for analysis, 11 discovery, and application as they relate to student 12 learning, social or emotional achievement, or well-being;

13 (2) professional development aligns to the licensee's 14 performance;

15 (3) outcomes for the activities must relate to student 16 growth or district improvement;

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(4) activities align to State-approved standards; and

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(5) higher education coursework.

19 (e) For each renewal cycle, each professional educator 20 licensee shall engage in professional development activities. 21 Prior to renewal, the licensee shall enter electronically into 22 the Educator Licensure Information System (ELIS) the name, 23 date, and location of the activity, the number of professional 24 development hours, and the provider's name. The following 25 provisions shall apply concerning professional development 26 activities:

1 (1) Each licensee shall complete a total of 120 hours 2 of professional development per 5-year renewal cycle in 3 order to renew the license, except as otherwise provided 4 in this Section.

5 (2) Beginning with his or her first full 5-year cycle, any licensee with an administrative endorsement who is not 6 working in a position requiring such endorsement is not 7 8 required to complete Illinois Administrators' Academy 9 courses, as described in Article 2 of this Code. Such 10 licensees must complete one Illinois Administrators' 11 Academy course within one year after returning to a position that requires the administrative endorsement. 12

(3) Any licensee with an administrative endorsement 13 14 who is working in a position requiring such endorsement or 15 an individual with a Teacher Leader endorsement serving in 16 an administrative capacity at least 50% of the day shall complete one Illinois Administrators' Academy course, as 17 described in Article 2 of this Code, each fiscal year in 18 addition to 100 hours of professional development per 19 20 5-year renewal cycle in accordance with this Code.

(4) Any licensee holding a current National Board for
Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) master teacher
designation shall complete a total of 60 hours of
professional development per 5-year renewal cycle in order
to renew the license.

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(5) Licensees working in a position that does not

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require educator licensure or working in a position for less than 50% for any particular year are considered to be exempt and shall be required to pay only the registration fee in order to renew and maintain the validity of the license.

(6) Licensees who are retired and qualify for benefits 6 7 from a State of Illinois retirement system shall notify 8 the State Board of Education using ELIS, and the license 9 shall be maintained in retired status. For any renewal 10 cycle in which a licensee retires during the renewal cycle, the licensee must complete professional development 11 12 activities on a prorated basis depending on the number of 13 years during the renewal cycle the educator held an active 14 license. If a licensee retires during a renewal cycle, the 15 licensee must notify the State Board of Education using ELIS that the licensee wishes to maintain the license in 16 17 retired status and must show proof of completion of professional development activities on a prorated basis 18 for all years of that renewal cycle for which the license 19 20 was active. An individual with a license in retired status 21 shall not be required to complete professional development 22 activities or pay registration fees until returning to a 23 position that requires educator licensure. Upon returning 24 to work in a position that requires the Professional 25 Educator License, the licensee shall immediately pay a 26 registration fee and complete renewal requirements for

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1 that year. A license in retired status cannot lapse. Beginning on January 6, 2017 (the effective date of Public 2 3 Act 99-920) through December 31, 2017, any licensee who has retired and whose license has lapsed for failure to 4 5 renew as provided in this Section may reinstate that license and maintain it in retired status upon providing 6 7 proof to the State Board of Education using ELIS that the 8 licensee is retired and is not working in a position that 9 requires a Professional Educator License.

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10 (7) For any renewal cycle in which professional development hours were required, but not fulfilled, the 11 licensee shall complete any missed hours to total the 12 13 minimum professional development hours required in this 14 Section prior to September 1 of that year. Professional 15 development hours used to fulfill the minimum required 16 hours for a renewal cycle may be used for only one renewal cycle. For any fiscal year or renewal cycle in which an 17 Illinois Administrators' Academy course was required but 18 19 not completed, the licensee shall complete any missed 20 Illinois Administrators' Academy courses prior to 21 September 1 of that year. The licensee may complete all 22 deficient hours and Illinois Administrators' Academy 23 courses while continuing to work in a position that 24 requires that license until September 1 of that year.

(8) Any licensee who has not fulfilled the
 professional development renewal requirements set forth in

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this Section at the end of any 5-year renewal cycle is ineligible to register his or her license and may submit an appeal to the State Superintendent of Education for reinstatement of the license.

5 (9) If professional development opportunities were unavailable to a licensee, proof that opportunities were 6 7 unavailable and request for an extension of time beyond 8 August 31 to complete the renewal requirements may be 9 submitted from April 1 through June 30 of that year to the 10 State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board. If an extension is approved, the license shall remain valid 11 12 during the extension period.

(10) Individuals who hold exempt licenses prior to December 27, 2013 (the effective date of Public Act 98-610) shall commence the annual renewal process with the first scheduled registration due after December 27, 2013 (the effective date of Public Act 98-610).

(11) Notwithstanding any other provision of this 18 19 subsection (e), if a licensee earns more than the required 20 number of professional development hours during a renewal 21 cycle, then the licensee may carry over any hours earned 22 from April 1 through June 30 of the last year of the 23 renewal cycle. Any hours carried over in this manner must 24 be applied to the next renewal cycle. Illinois 25 Administrators' Academy courses or hours earned in those 26 courses may not be carried over.

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<u>(e-5) The number of professional development hours</u>
 <u>required under subsection (e) is reduced by 20% for any</u>
 renewal cycle that includes the 2021-2022 school year.

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4 (f) At the time of renewal, each licensee shall respond to5 the required questions under penalty of perjury.

(f-5) The State Board of Education shall conduct random 6 audits of licensees to verify a licensee's fulfillment of the 7 8 professional development hours required under this Section. 9 Upon completion of a random audit, if it is determined by the 10 State Board of Education that the licensee did not complete 11 the required number of professional development hours or did not provide sufficient proof of completion, the licensee shall 12 13 be notified that his or her license has lapsed. A license that 14 has lapsed under this subsection may be reinstated as provided 15 in subsection (b).

16 (g) The following entities shall be designated as approved 17 to provide professional development activities for the renewal 18 of Professional Educator Licenses:

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(1) The State Board of Education.

20 (2) Regional offices of education and intermediate
 21 service centers.

(3) Illinois professional associations representing
the following groups that are approved by the State
Superintendent of Education:

25 26 (A) school administrators;

(B) principals;

(C) school business officials;
 (D) teachers, including special education
 teachers;
 (E) school boards;

- (F) school districts;
- 6 (G) parents; and

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(H) school service personnel.

8 (4) Regionally accredited institutions of higher 9 education that offer Illinois-approved educator 10 preparation programs and public community colleges subject 11 to the Public Community College Act.

(5) Illinois public school districts, charter schools
authorized under Article 27A of this Code, and joint
educational programs authorized under Article 10 of this
Code for the purposes of providing career and technical
education or special education services.

(6) A not-for-profit organization that, as of December
31, 2014 (the effective date of Public Act 98-1147), has
had or has a grant from or a contract with the State Board
of Education to provide professional development services
in the area of English Learning to Illinois school
districts, teachers, or administrators.

23 (7) State agencies, State boards, and State
 24 commissions.

(8) Museums as defined in Section 10 of the Museum
 Disposition of Property Act.

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1 Approved providers under subsection (q) of this (h) available professional development 2 Section shall make 3 opportunities that satisfy at least one of the following: 4 (1) increase the knowledge and skills of school and 5 district leaders who quide continuous professional development; 6 (2) improve the learning of students; 7 8 (3) organize adults into learning communities whose 9 goals are aligned with those of the school and district; 10 (4) deepen educator's content knowledge; 11 (5)provide educators with research-based instructional strategies to assist students in meeting 12 13 rigorous academic standards; (6) prepare educators to appropriately use various 14 15 types of classroom assessments; 16 use learning strategies appropriate to the (7)17 intended goals; 18 (8) provide educators with the knowledge and skills to collaborate; 19 20 (9) prepare educators to apply research to decision 21 making; 22 (10) provide educators with training on inclusive practices in the classroom that examines instructional and 23 24 behavioral strategies that improve academic and 25 social-emotional outcomes for all students, with or 26 without disabilities, in a general education setting; or

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1 (11) beginning on July 1, 2022, provide educators with 2 training on the physical and mental health needs of 3 students, student safety, educator ethics, professional 4 conduct, and other topics that address the well-being of 5 students and improve the academic and social-emotional 6 outcomes of students.

7 (i) Approved providers under subsection (g) of this8 Section shall do the following:

9 (1) align professional development activities to the 10 State-approved national standards for professional 11 learning;

12 (2) meet the professional development criteria for13 Illinois licensure renewal;

14 (3) produce a rationale for the activity that explains 15 how it aligns to State standards and identify the 16 assessment for determining the expected impact on student 17 learning or school improvement;

18 (4) maintain original documentation for completion of 19 activities;

20 (5) provide license holders with evidence of 21 completion of activities;

(6) request an Illinois Educator Identification Number
(IEIN) for each educator during each professional
development activity; and

(7) beginning on July 1, 2019, register annually with
 the State Board of Education prior to offering any

1 professional development opportunities in the current 2 fiscal year.

(j) The State Board of Education shall conduct annual 3 4 audits of a subset of approved providers, except for school 5 districts, which shall be audited by regional offices of education and intermediate service centers. The State Board of 6 Education shall ensure that each approved provider, except for 7 8 a school district, is audited at least once every 5 years. The State Board of Education may conduct more frequent audits of 9 10 providers if evidence suggests the requirements of this 11 Section or administrative rules are not being met.

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(1) (Blank).

13 (2) Approved providers shall comply with the 14 requirements in subsections (h) and (i) of this Section by 15 annually submitting data to the State Board of Education 16 demonstrating how the professional development activities 17 impacted one or more of the following:

18 (A) educator and student growth in regards to19 content knowledge or skills, or both;

20 (B) educator and student social and emotional21 growth; or

(C) alignment to district or school improvementplans.

(3) The State Superintendent of Education shall review
the annual data collected by the State Board of Education,
regional offices of education, and intermediate service

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centers in audits to determine if the approved provider has met the criteria and should continue to be an approved provider or if further action should be taken as provided in rules.

5 (k) Registration fees shall be paid for the next renewal 6 cycle between April 1 and June 30 in the last year of each 7 5-year renewal cycle using ELIS. If all required professional 8 development hours for the renewal cycle have been completed 9 and entered by the licensee, the licensee shall pay the 10 registration fees for the next cycle using a form of credit or 11 debit card.

(1) Any professional educator licensee endorsed for school 12 13 support personnel who is employed and performing services in 14 Illinois public schools and who holds an active and current 15 professional license issued by the Department of Financial and 16 Professional Regulation or a national certification board, as approved by the State Board of Education, related to the 17 endorsement areas on the Professional Educator License shall 18 19 be deemed to have satisfied the continuing professional 20 development requirements provided for in this Section. Such individuals shall be required to pay only registration fees to 21 renew the Professional Educator License. An individual who 22 23 does not hold a license issued by the Department of Financial 24 Professional Regulation shall complete professional and 25 development requirements for the renewal of a Professional 26 Educator License provided for in this Section.

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1 (m) Appeals to the State Educator Preparation and 2 Licensure Board must be made within 30 days after receipt of 3 notice from the State Superintendent of Education that a 4 license will not be renewed based upon failure to complete the 5 requirements of this Section. A licensee may appeal that 6 decision to the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board 7 in a manner prescribed by rule.

8 (1) Each appeal shall state the reasons why the State 9 Superintendent's decision should be reversed and shall be 10 sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the 11 State Board of Education.

12 (2) The State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board 13 shall review each appeal regarding renewal of a license 14 within 90 days after receiving the appeal in order to 15 determine whether the licensee has met the requirements of 16 this Section. The State Educator Preparation and Licensure 17 Board may hold an appeal hearing or may make its 18 determination based upon the record of review, which shall consist of the following: 19

20 (A) the regional superintendent of education's
21 rationale for recommending nonrenewal of the license,
22 if applicable;

(B) any evidence submitted to the State
Superintendent along with the individual's electronic
statement of assurance for renewal; and

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(C) the State Superintendent's rationale for

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nonrenewal of the license.

2 (3) The State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board shall notify the licensee of its decision regarding 3 4 license renewal by certified mail, return receipt 5 requested, no later than 30 days after reaching a 6 decision. Upon receipt of notification of renewal, the licensee, using ELIS, shall 7 pay the applicable registration fee for the next cycle using a form of credit 8 9 or debit card.

(n) The State Board of Education may adopt rules as may benecessary to implement this Section.
