1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4706

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend House Bill 4706 by replacing  
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The University of Illinois Hospital Act is  
5 amended by adding Section 8g as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 330/8g new)

7 Sec. 8g. Cesarean section reporting.

8 (a) The University of Illinois Hospital shall record and  
9 internally report the NTSV cesarean birth rate for each  
10 obstetrician-gynecologist who works at the University of  
11 Illinois Hospital every 6 months. The University of Illinois  
12 Hospital shall submit a copy of this report annually and upon  
13 request to the Department of Public Health with the names of  
14 the providers redacted.

15 (b) As used in this Section, "NTSV cesarean birth rate"  
16 means the proportion of live babies born at or beyond 37 weeks

1 gestation to women in their first pregnancy, that are  
2 singleton (no twins or beyond) and in the vertex presentation  
3 (no breech or transverse positions), via cesarean birth.

4 (c) This Section is repealed on January 1, 2030.

5 Section 10. The Hospital Licensing Act is amended by  
6 adding Section 6.33 as follows:

7 (210 ILCS 85/6.33 new)

8 Sec. 6.33. Cesarean section reporting.

9 (a) A hospital shall record and internally report the NTSV  
10 cesarean birth rate for each obstetrician-gynecologist who  
11 works at the hospital every 6 months. The hospital shall  
12 submit a copy of this report annually and upon request to the  
13 Department of Public Health with the names of the providers  
14 redacted.

15 (b) As used in this Section, "NTSV cesarean birth rate"  
16 means the proportion of live babies born at or beyond 37 weeks  
17 gestation to women in their first pregnancy, that are  
18 singleton (no twins or beyond) and in the vertex presentation  
19 (no breech or transverse positions), via cesarean birth.

20 (c) This Section is repealed on January 1, 2030."
