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#### ARTICLE 2

Section 5. The sum of \$80,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and remains unexpended, at the close of business on June 30, 2022, from the appropriation heretofore made in Article 82, section 10, and Article 82, section 15, of Public Act 102-0017 as amended, is reappropriated from the VW Settlement Environmental Mitigation Fund to the Environmental

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Protection Agency for all costs, including administrative expenses, associated with funding eligible mitigation actions that achieve reductions of emissions in accordance with the Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement relating to the Partial Consent Decree between U.S. Department of Justice, Volkswagen AG and other settling defendants.

7 Section 10.
