- 9 Section 75. The sum of \$550,000, or so much thereof as may
- 10 be necessary, is appropriated from the Underground Storage Tank
- 11 Fund to the Office of the State Fire Marshal for a grant to the
- City of Chicago for administrative costs incurred as a result 12
- 13 of the State's Underground Storage Program.
- 14 Section 99. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July
- 1, 2022. 15
