A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 OPERATIONAL EXPENSES

6 Section 5. In addition to other amounts appropriated, the
7 amount of \$10,141,500, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
8 respectively, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to
9 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
10 operational expenses, awards, grants and permanent improvements
11 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, including prior year
12 costs.

13 Section 10. The following named amounts, or so much thereof
