### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

430 ILCS 67/10

Amends the Firearms Restraining Order Act. Provides that a firearms restraining order may be granted against a respondent under the Act regardless of whether the respondent has in his or her custody or control a firearm, ammunition, or firearm parts that could be assembled to make an operable firearm.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Firearms Restraining Order Act is amended
by changing Section 10 as follows:

6 (430 ILCS 67/10)

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Sec. 10. Commencement of action; procedure.

8 (a) An action for a firearms restraining order is 9 commenced by filing a verified petition for a firearms 10 restraining order in any circuit court.

(b) A petition for a firearms restraining order may be 11 filed in: (1) any county where the respondent resides or (2) 12 any county where an incident occurred that involved the 13 14 respondent posing an immediate and present danger of causing personal injury to the respondent or another by having in his 15 or her custody or control, or purchasing, possessing, or 16 17 receiving, a firearm, ammunition, or firearm parts that could be assembled to make an operable firearm. 18

(c) No fee shall be charged by the clerk for filing, amending, vacating, certifying, printing, or photocopying petitions or orders; or for issuing alias summons; or for any related filing service. No fee shall be charged by the sheriff or other law enforcement for service by the sheriff or other

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1 law enforcement of a petition, rule, motion, or order in an 2 action commenced under this Section.

3 (d) The court shall provide, through the office of the
4 clerk of the court, simplified forms and clerical assistance
5 to help with the writing and filing of a petition under this
6 Section by any person not represented by counsel. In addition,
7 that assistance may be provided by the State's Attorney.

8 <u>(e) A firearms restraining order may be granted against a</u> 9 <u>respondent under this Act regardless of whether the respondent</u> 10 <u>has in his or her custody or control a firearm, ammunition, or</u> 11 <u>firearm parts that could be assembled to make an operable</u> 12 <u>firearm.</u>
