2 WHEREAS, Juneteenth recognizes the abolition of slavery in 3 the United States and its territories in 1865; and

WHEREAS, President Lincoln enacted the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, freeing slaves throughout the south, but it was not until June 19, 1865, over two years later and over two months after General Robert E. Lee's surrender at Appomattox Court House, that slaves in Galveston, Texas received the news, making it the official end of slavery; and

- 10 WHEREAS, Juneteenth is a celebration of freedom from 11 bondage and oppression; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The African-American Cultural & Genealogical
 13 Society, in Partnership with the City of Decatur Human
 14 Relations Commission, will be holding its 27th Juneteenth
 15 celebration on Saturday, June 19, 2021 in downtown Decatur,
 16 which will include a wreath ceremony, Freedom Day Walk, and a
 17 variety of festivities, including giveaways, vendors, food,
 18 entertainment, fun, and culture; therefore, be it
- 19 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE
 20 HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that
 21 we recognize the City of Decatur's Juneteenth celebration as a

1 time to reflect and to commemorate the end of slavery; and be
